

CHERIN HOPES FOR AMERICAN AID
 "Nothing Fundamental Can Be Accomplished at Hague Without U. S." He Says
 WILL NOT ATTEND PARLEY

 Berlin, June 8.—Foreign Minister Chicherin, of Soviet Russia, today announced that he would not go to the Hague, in answer to a question on Russia's attitude toward America. M. Chicherin said: "Nothing fundamental can be accomplished at The Hague without the participation of the United States, and we trust that its government will change its attitude toward Russia and decide to participate in the reconstruction of our country."
 "Governor Goodrich has frequently told us in Moscow," M. Chicherin continued, "that he thinks the United States should deal with the Soviet Government on the same terms as American government, and many other investigations have told us the same after investigations in Russia. Americans who have no ancient property interests and have not been identified with the old Russian government generally like the new regime. But men like Charles R. Conant and others who were identified with the old regime are our enemies."
 London, June 8.—Leonid Krassin, Soviet Commissioner of Foreign Trade, today transmitted to the Archbishop of Canterbury the reply of the Soviet to the protests of the Christian Churches of Great Britain against the attack on the Russian Church in the person of Dr. Tikhon, patriarch of all Russia. The reply, which is signed by M. Krassin, administration manager of the Council of Commissars, denies any attack on the Church. It says legal proceedings were taken by the Russian Government against Tikhon and other ecclesiastics for having resisted the Soviet's measures to save the lives of tens of millions of human beings. It adds that the vast majority of Russian clergy are with the Soviet in the liquidation of Church treasures, while those resisting the order form an insignificant minority who always have worked hand in hand with Czarism and Nobility.
 The reply charges that those making the protests did not raise their voices when Russia was blockaded, and that the Soviet considers the protests to be "dictated by a narrow caste and entirely directed against the real interests of the people and the elementary demands of humanity."
 The Archbishop of Canterbury has replied to M. Krassin, backing up the original protest, which he says was based on first-hand information. The Archbishop added that Patriarch Tikhon repeatedly offered the aid of the Church to relieve the famine situation, but the Soviet constantly refused to accept it. Permission is requested by the Archbishop for a small body of representatives of the churches of England to enter Russia and investigate the situation on the spot.

WOMEN ASK LABOR INQUIRY
 Trade League Urges Congressional Investigation of Conditions
 Washington, Ill., June 8.—A resolution asking that Congress order an immediate investigation into the economic status and labor conditions of women in the home, both the paid servant and the housewife doing her own work, was adopted yesterday by the National Women's Trade Union League of America convention here.
 Other resolutions urged that war be outlawed by giving The Hague Tribunal power to punish war makers; that unemployment compensation legislation be passed by Congress, and condemned the "efforts of the Women's Party to take out of the hands of industrial women the power to decide under what conditions they should work"; approved the Women's Party plan to remove the legal disabilities of married women and mothers and the political disabilities of women; urged the Government immediately to renew trade relations with Russia; asked the Government to grant amnesty to all political prisoners similar to that granted in previous wars; endorsed the coal miners' strike; protested against the Supreme Court's child-labor decision, and pledged support to the American Federation of Labor educational program.

 London, June 8.—Twenty-one American women and girls to be presented at Court will be presented to King George and Queen Mary by Mrs. George Harcourt, wife of the American Ambassador, during the first of three Court functions to be held this season at Buckingham Palace.
 The event will be distinguished by the return of all the pre-war pomp associated with such occasions. There will be nearly 450 diplomats and official presentations in addition to a part of the season's debutantes, who thus will formally re-enter society.
