BISHOP KILGO WEAKER

Will Be Taken Home, However, Unless He Becomes Worse
Memphis, Tenn., June 8.—(By A. P.)—Bishop John C. Kilgo, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, critically ill at a hospital here, will be taken to his home at Charlotte, N. C., unless there is a turn for the worse, attending physicians announced today. Bishop Kilgo rallied yesterday, passed a restless night and was somewhat weaker early today.

Different From House Bill

This measure differs somewhat from the House bill and is very widely from the Bonus Bill that was reported to the Senate last year and later sent back to the Finance Committee at the request of President Harding. The most important change from the original measure is the elimination of the cash bonus and reclamation features. As now drafted the legislation would give each veteran the right to select any one of the following plans:

McCumber Explains Bill

Explaining the bill, Chairman McCumber said that the amount of the adjusted service credit would be at the rate of \$1 a day for domestic service and \$1.25 for foreign service, less the \$30 bonus paid when the veterans were discharged from the service. In no event, however, could the total exceed \$500 in the case of those who had only domestic service, at \$625 for those who had both domestic and foreign service.

Reclamation Provision Eliminated

Chairman McCumber said the committee had recommended elimination of the reclamation provision of the House bill for three reasons:
"Any reclamation scheme will be exceedingly expensive and will in the end necessitate the expenditure of millions of dollars; it will be many years before a veteran will be able to determine whether he could secure any rights under such plan and where the projects will be located; and in making an application for such aid, the veteran would not know anything relative to the location, cost or advantage of the project."

Pinchot's Statement

Mr. Pinchot's clear statement on assessments is as follows:
"If I have an opportunity Saturday to address the Republican State Committee in Philadelphia, I want to call the attention of its members to the desirability of making the financial policy and practice of the committee as careful, accurate and inclusive as if the committee were a company or a corporation."
"During the primary campaign I took the position that I was opposed to the levying of assessments for political purposes upon persons holding State offices, and promised that no money raised by such assessments would be used for the expenses of my election with my consent."
"The promise thus made is as binding after the primary as it was before. I shall mention this matter because my public promise will make it necessary either for the State Committee to abandon assessments upon officeholders as a means of meeting campaign expenses, or for me to conduct my own campaign as the Republican candidate for Governor separately from the State Committee, which I should deeply regret."
Word has reached Grey Towers that the contractor combine which supported Attorney General Aker for Governor in the primary election fight is determined to name William P. Gallagher as secretary of the State Committee to succeed W. Harry Baker.
Mr. Pinchot declined to comment on this report. Gallagher holds down one of the seats in the Republican State Committee headquarters marked "publicly director." He is also the organization leader of Luzerne County.
