**West Grove Woman Accused in
Two-Year-Old Double Mur-
der May Retaliate**

SAY ACCUSER ACTED RASHLY

Hints of counter-charges are being heard from West Grove, who was arrested Tuesday charged with being an accessory before the fact in the double murder of Mrs. Frances Boyle and her daughter, Ruth, in May 30, 1931, when Mrs. Boyle was shot and killed by LeRoy Eichelberger and her daughter, Ruth, eleven years old, and then ended her own life.

Would Rather Drop Matter

"My friends have urged me to swear out a warrant for Dunlop's arrest for making slanderous statements concerning myself and family," she continued, "but I have not yet decided just what to do.
