As a result of two fires discovered early yesterday morning in the basement of the Sunday school and library building of the North Baptist Church, Fourth street between Penn and Linden streets, Camden, police are looking for a mysterious night prowler who was seen in the vicinity of the church shortly before the fire were discovered.

According to Fred Barnes, sexton of the church, the fires were of incendiary origin. Both blazes, which were located about forty feet apart in the basement, appeared to have been set by hand, he said. His belief is strengthened by an open gate in the rear of the building and a broken lock on the rear door.

Barnes, who occupies the third floor of the Sunday school building with his wife and eight children, said he smelled smoke early yesterday morning, and upon entering the basement discovered flames. After turning in an alarm he extinguished one blaze, and the other was put out by the fire company.
