Shaft in Honor of Author of "Star Spangled Banner" Unveiled in Baltimore

By the Associated Press Baltimore, June 14.—Francis Scott Key's memory, honored today by the unveiling of a monument to him, erected by Congress near the spot in historic Fort Mifflin, over which floated the "Star Spangled Banner," immortalized in his poem, made the first of the Mecca of a throng which gathered there long before the hour fixed for the arrival of President Harding, who was to accept the memorial for the Nation.

300 DROWN IN SALVADOR

INCOME TAX DATA SHOW SLUMP IN BIG INCOMES

Washington, June 14.—Statistics issued by Internal Revenue Commissioner Blair show that the number of million-dollar-a-year incomes in the United States decreased in 1922 to thirty-three, as compared with sixty-five in 1919. Net incomes of individuals gained by nearly \$4,000,000,000 and the number of returns by nearly 2,000,000.
