bor across Great Egg Harbor Inlet, draws thousands of visitors during the winter.

It must be admitted that Atlantic City has better railroad facilities and theatrical attractions, but it will be no fault of the officers of the Ocean City Chamber of Commerce if there is not a decided improvement in railway travel between residents and Philadelphia and New York within the coming year.

This organization is working energetically to have a short line constructed from Ocean City to a point connecting with the Pennsylvania Railroad between Hammonton and Egg Harbor City. The officials of the railroad are said to be in sympathy with the movement, and it is confidently predicted that this road will be a reality before many months.

The proposed ocean-front hotel here will be an assured fact, it is authoritatively stated by the city engineer. The site has been selected, after a delay of several weeks. The hotel will be built on the ocean front at Eleventh street. The city is no question as to the matter of financing or building the structure, which is to be fireproof, and have accommodations for between 200 and 250 guests. It will cost \$1,000,000.

Ocean City is also planning cottages, as well as hotel guests owning machines, are happy because of the positive assurance from those close to the fountain head that the automobile bridge and highway between this city and Somers Point, over Great Egg Harbor Bay, will be freed from toll charges August 15.

A committee will soon be appointed by the City Commissioners, whose duties it will be to take charge of the proposed public tennis courts on the southern side of Atlantic avenue, between Fifth and Sixth streets, which will be open to the public, a small garage will be made for their use by devotees of the game, the money thus secured to be used for upkeep.

The number of the members of the city's beach patrol now on duty will be increased as the season advances. Captain "Jack" Jernee, in charge of the patrol, says this resort has the champion swimming relay team along the New Jersey coast. The plan is to have some races as an attraction on the beach on the afternoon of the Fourth of July. The guards will have an automobile ambulance the season long. It will be located on the beach at Tenth street, near one of the emergency hospitals.

Dr. W. P. Haines, the popular beach surgeon, is again on duty. He will have a trained nurse as his assistant this year. Captain Jernee will have the guards on two "shifts" this summer. Any delegation remaining on duty until 1 o'clock in the evening, these being for the protection of the commuter who may desire to take a dip after he has reached his cottage.

That Ocean City is progressing by leaps and bounds is revealed by the records of the office of Building Inspector H. C. Smith in a way that cannot be disputed. For the first five months of this year the value of the buildings for which permits were issued approximated the sum of \$1,500,180.

The total amount of the building permits last year, which was a record breaker, was \$1,341,516. The value of the buildings constructed during the first five months of 1921 was \$367,030. From the standpoint of the people financially interested in Ocean City, this is a case where comparisons are not odious.

Three large operations are being planned now. One of these will be in the north section of the resort and the others in the central part of the city. The promoters in one instance contemplate the erection of a desirable residence, completely and attractively finished, ready for sale and occupancy. The plans for these dwellings, which provide for a better class of houses, have been drawn and a quantity of the material purchased.

One of the other operations will be along the same line, but not quite so expensive, and this work will be pushed. The third operation will comprise the thorough improvement of land purchased, the lots graded and sidewalks

## SMUGGLERS' NOTCH HIGH IN MOUNTAINS

### Once Secret Pass for Smuggled Goods From Canada—Now on Excellent Auto Routes

Montpelier, Vt., June 14.—Smugglers' Notch at the base of Mount Mansfield, has an altitude of 4457 feet, being the highest mountain in the State and the loftiest peak of the Green Mountain system.

The name Smugglers' Notch was given more than one hundred years ago. During the embargo period, when trade with foreign countries was prohibited and during the War of 1812 that followed, many articles were smuggled across the Vermont border from Canada, many of them being intended for the Boston market. It was discovered that a route through this pass from the Canadian border to Massachusetts was shorter and less likely to be frequented by revenue officers than the regular highway. Consequently many smuggled goods were carried through this mountain route, and the name still lingers as a reminder of the revenue evasion of an early period of American history.

There are two routes from Lake Champlain and Burlington to St. Johnsbury and the White Mountains. One is by way of the Winouski River Valley and Montpelier, thence through Marshfield, Cabot and Danville. The other and more northerly route is by way of Essex Junction, under the Lake Champlain River, thence through Cambridge, Johnson, Hyde Park, Morrisstown and Hardwick. This new route connects the Winouski River and the Lamolle River Valley to the White Mountains, and is a get-out on the way to or from the White Mountains, or a short trip may be taken from Burlington, going by way of Essex Junction, under the Lake Champlain River, thence through Cambridge, Johnson, Hyde Park, Morrisstown and Hardwick. This new route connects the Winouski River and the Lamolle River Valley to the White Mountains, and is a get-out on the way to or from the White Mountains, or a short trip may be taken from Burlington, going by way of Essex Junction, under the Lake Champlain River, thence through Cambridge, Johnson, Hyde Park, Morrisstown and Hardwick.

If one follows the Winouski Valley highway he will proceed from Burlington to Waterbury, going thence to Stowe, from Stowe through Smugglers' Notch to Jeffersonville in the town of Cambridge. The distance from Waterbury to Jeffersonville by this route is probably a little less than thirty miles. For a part of the way through the mountain pass the cliffs rise perpendicularly for a thousand feet or more. During past ages great boulders have been detached from these rocky heights and have come thundering down, nowing a path through the forest. Some

are very ancient and moss covered and others are of comparatively recent arrival. Some of the cliff formations have been carved by the elements into curious shapes. One known as the elephant's head resembles the head and trunk of an elephant.

From the base of a great rock in the notch flows a spring of almost ice-cold water, said to be the purest ever analyzed in the Vermont State Laboratory. This spring flows at the rate of 200 gallons a minute and almost immediately forms a large brook. Within a short distance it falls over the rocks more than eighty feet, and the foam falls is one of the beauty spots of this remarkable region.

Through a natural flume the water pours down into a rocky pool, from which the mist rises in rainbow hues. Lustrous ferns and mosses form a charming setting for this picturesque waterfall.

Mount Mansfield itself may be reached by a good carriage road with easy grades, which can be ascended by all except the smaller and less powerful automobiles.
