

WHITE SULPHUR ENJOYS FINE SEASON

Summer Months Particularly Attractive at the Greenbrier
GOLF TOURNEYS IN AUGUST

White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., June 14.—Close upon the heels of the most successful spring season that White Sulphur Springs has ever had come the summer months and with them every indication of the brilliancy and gaiety for which White Sulphur has been noted since the days before the Civil War. As in former years when the Old White, as it is now affectionately called, was the Mecca for the fashionable families of the South, so today the resort, which has increased in popularity and is recognized as the most fashionable Spa in the East, attracts the interesting groups of this period. Members of the official and executive circles in Washington make frequent visits to the Greenbrier, and from every city there is a gathering of prominent families who come to remain through the summer.

The summer months have always been particularly gay at White Sulphur Springs and many fascinating tales in history have their setting at the West Virginia resort. It has been only in the last few years, however, that the resort has assumed its greater prominence to Northern parties. There has been a great increase in the number of parties coming from Northern and Eastern cities and the Philadelphia colony is one of the most prominent here. Cottage life has always been a feature of the summer at White Sulphur, and it was here that the cottage colony was introduced many years ago. Surrounding the great park which forms a setting for the Greenbrier and the Old White are rows and rows of dainty white cottages, many covered with green vines and others with attractive boxes of bright flowers. A certain social atmosphere obtains among the cottage colonies, and many of the hotel life and it is a distinct addition. The Greenbrier is more like a great country house than a hotel, and every one enters into the spirit of the life there, so that at evening when the nightly motion pictures are shown, it is like a happy house party assembled for some special event. During August, when social parties reach their height, many gay dinner parties are given at the Greenbrier. Unique in its architecture and radiating an atmosphere of refinement and hospitality, the Greenbrier has become a regular summer home for many New York and Philadelphia families.

The Old White, which opens its last week in June, will receive their Southern parties and families, who have been coming regularly for a number of years. The broad porches of the Old White are scenes of many jolly parties and informal gatherings, and dining at the hotel of olden days with its beautiful architecture of the American Colonial period is that atmosphere of romance that is so dominant throughout the South. Golf is a sport much pursued during the summer months at White Sulphur. Both the eighteen-hole course and the short course are played by many enthusiasts every day. Charles Blair Macdonald, the noted golf architect, is

at present drawing plans for another long course that will be along the Howard Creek Valley and open up some new and beautiful views of the mountains. Then will White Sulphur be a second Plover, and many golfers will flock there who were before unable to secure reservations. The annual Greenbrier summer golf championship is a feature in August that attracts golfers there, and for tennis enthusiasts there are several events arranged culminating in the annual tennis championship in August.

ENJOYABLE NIGHTS AT VIRGINIA HOT SPRINGS

Homestead Italian Gardens Popular, Attractive and Unusually Beautiful

Hot Springs, Va., June 14.—The Virginia Hot Springs can always be counted upon for the absence of humidity, just as it assures clear morning air and cool nights for sleeping. The valley is in the leveliest section of the Alleghenies, a mass of trees and streams and smiling mountainsides. This is a fascinating stretch of scenery in which the stream runs and swirls and falls in the most engaging and artistic manner. Alum, a quaint old place in a sun-filled valley ten miles away, is popular with those who like the joys of picknicking.

While there is motoring to Conington Mountain, where the view of the valley is inspiring, and there is motoring to White Sulphur Springs, in the neighboring State, for luncheon at the Greenbrier. The Homestead itself is the last word in beauty and in comfort. It has charming, graceful lines, wide porches and an enchanting outlook from every window. The great hall is a feature, a long room, with high ceilings and white columns in stately rows. The decoration is green and white. The ballroom is oval and the gallery beside it filled with palms and flowering plants and looking out upon lawns and trees. There is a swimming pool and there are tennis courts and putting greens delightfully placed, and the golf links, one of nine holes and the other of eighteen, are through a rolling country of exceeding loveliness. The Italian garden, with its vases, vines and flowers, its terraces and white marble fountains, is an enchanting place for after-luncheon and after-dinner coffee. The society of the Virginia Hot

Spings colony is noted for its very high tone. The resort is not a place for excitement seekers nor for the sensation-hungry. It is a place for well-bred people who love beauty for the sake of beauty, and who love it in its most modern and luxurious form. There are three churches here, presided over by cultured and capable clergymen, and there is a high class girls' school, the Homestead School, situated at the head of the golf links, where parents may place their daughters in well-bred surroundings.
