

PARKING BANNED ON CHESTNUT ST.

Thousands of Copies of New Ordinance Ordered for Benefit of Motorists

RULING ON OTHER STREETS

Parking of automobiles on Chestnut street between Tenth and Sixteenth streets is banned, and on all other central city streets it is limited to one hour. In a traffic ordinance passed by City Council yesterday.

The one-hour parking rule applied to all streets within the territory bounded by Vine, Pine, Seventh and Twentieth streets.

Beyond that limit parking is permitted for an unlimited period.

The ordinance ended a discussion that has lasted for months, and supplants all previous legislation on the subject. Thousands of copies were ordered printed and distributed among the motorists.

The ordinance was adopted by a vote of 19 to 1. Councilman Roper saying that traffic was an engineering problem that did not need to be tinkered with by Councilmen.

An experiment in the handling of traffic is provided for in the section that prohibits all parking between 4:30 and 6:30 P. M. on Broad street between Erie and South streets and on Arch and Market streets from Seventh street to Schuylkill.

The proviso is designed to clear the main arteries of traffic to all parked vehicles during the evening rush hour in order to accelerate the flow of traffic from the center of the city. If successful it will also be extended to include other streets and the morning rush hour. Loading stations forty feet in length are provided in the middle of all blocks in the parking area.

Whether the Mayor will sign the ordinance remains to be seen. He has sought Mr. Roper's consent to have this ordinance providing for one hour parking on the busy downtown thoroughfares, but councilman leaders say they have the thirteen votes necessary to pass the ordinance over a veto in the event the Mayor disapproves the ordinance.

The proviso in the ordinance requires the motorist to extend his arm as a warning signal at least ten feet in advance of making a turn or coming to a stop. Mr. Roper sought to have this distance increased to fifty feet and was voted down.

Law Enforcement League Secretary Sees Great Disclosure

Members of the Law Enforcement League who reported hundreds of prohibition law violations in this city to the police are confident that great disclosures will result from the investigation now under way, according to the secretary, William H. Nicholson, Jr.

Mr. Nicholson highly commends Mayor Moore for making possible the widespread vice investigation. He condemned the favorable consideration by the courts of transfers of licenses allowing saloons to sell soft drinks, "when in reality there is a mere cloak for the liquor traffic, and has often for that reason an extortionate price attached to it."

"That the increase in drunkenness is sufficient proof of the illicit traffic in drinks, notwithstanding the claims of some that crime is at a low ebb, is claimed also by Mr. Nicholson.

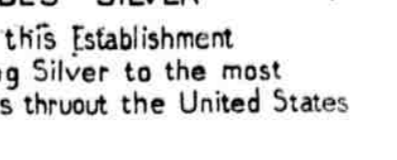
