FRANCIS WILLIAMS, AUTHOR, IS DEAD

Funeral Services Will Take Place Tomorrow in St. Luke's Church, Germantown

WROTE MANY POEMS



FRANCIS HOWARD WILLIAMS

Francis Howard Williams, author, poet, and descendant of one of the oldest families in the State, who died at his home in Germantown yesterday in his seventy-eighth year, will be buried tomorrow afternoon.

Mr. Williams, whose ancestry in this country goes back to the days of William Penn, had been ill since the death of his wife, Mrs. Mary B. Houston Williams, in February, 1920. Most of his life had been devoted to literature and he was known as a leader in many literary movements.

He began a business career, and although, as it turned out, he was destined for the world of art, his business ventures were all successful. From lumbering he turned to the wool business as a member of the firm of Seal, Williams & Co.

My love too stately is to be but fair, Too fair she is for naught but stateliness; She bids me nay and yet a silent yes, Die with me in the dusk her shadowy eyelids close.

Mr. Williams was born in this city September 2, 1844. He was the son of Joseph J. Williams and Martha P. Shoemaker Williams. His early education was received from tutors and later, at the Baldwin Classical School at Broad and Arch streets, from which he was graduated in 1860.

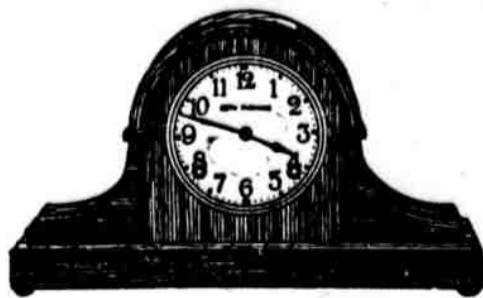
PLAN TO PASS TARIFF BILL BEFORE TAKING UP BONUS

Republican Caucus Expected to Adopt Compromise Today Washington, June 19.—(By A. P.)—Adoption at the conference of Republican Senators today of the compromise plan to dispose of the tariff bill before taking up the soldiers' bonus measure, with a pledge that it shall have right of way and be brought to a vote before adjournment, was predicted by the party leaders of all factions.

A sharp fight was in prospect before the question was settled on the floor of the Senate, a few Republicans not in agreement on the plan and Democratic advocates of the bonus promising to make an attempt there to obtain displacement of the tariff bill to permit immediate consideration of the bonus.

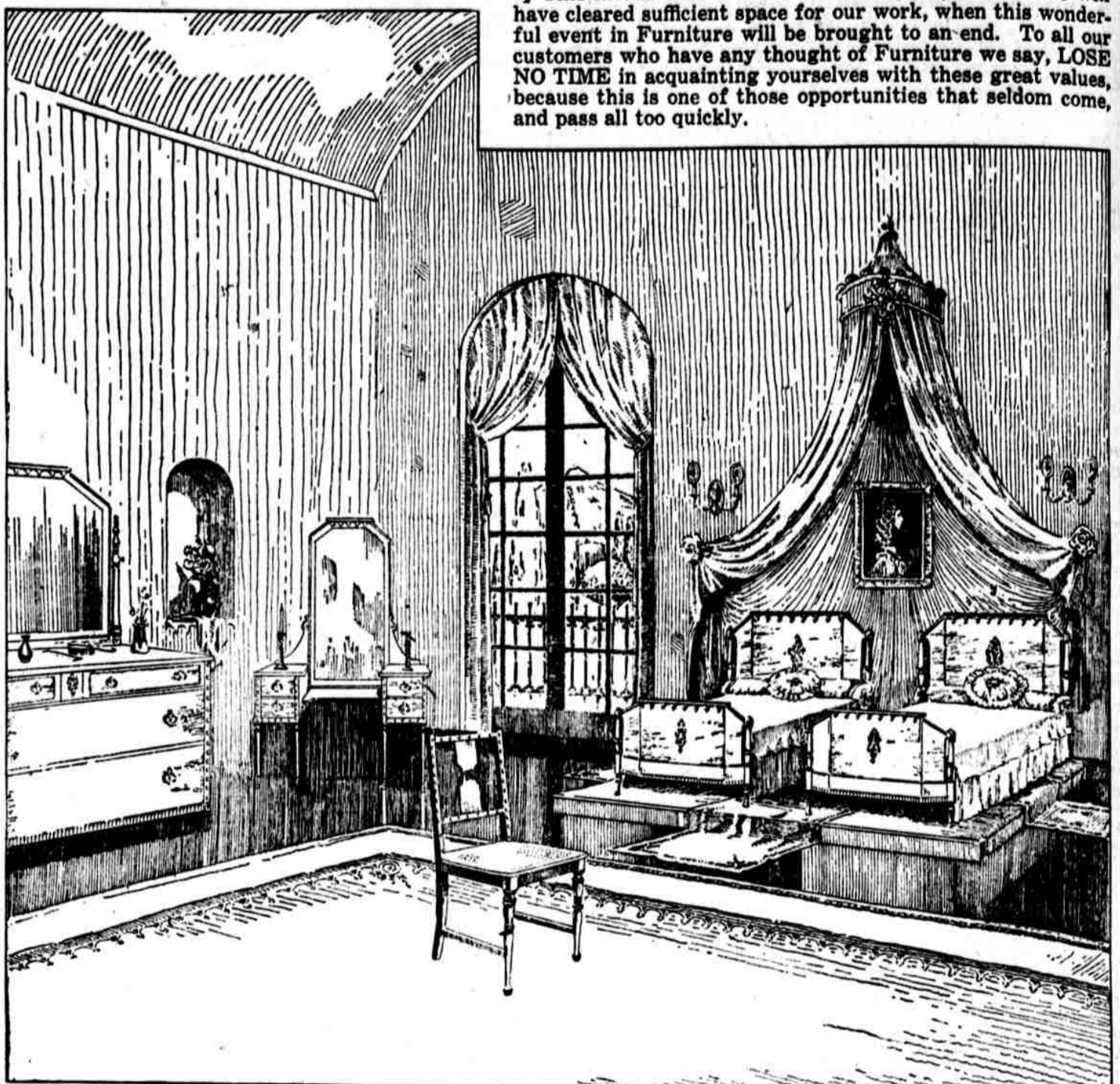
