WARD'S LAWYERS RECEIVE SETBACK
Court Reserves Decision on Application to Inspect Grand Jury Minutes

INQUEST AGAIN POSTPONED
White Plains, N. Y., June 25.—Supreme Court Justice Marschauer, re-elected today when attorneys for Walter S. Ward, in jail charged with murdering Clarence Peters, asked the right to inspect the grand jury minutes on which the indictment for first-degree murder was based.

Independent Investigation

DECISIONS OF RAIL BOARD UNLIKELY TO AVERT STRIKE
Preliminary "War Council" to Be Held by Union Officials Tonight
Chicago, June 25.—By A. P. Saturday's decisions by the United States Railroad Labor Board holding several roads in violation of the Transportation Act by forcing out work on contractors, and pending opinions in thirty more cases which were posted for hearing today, are expected in railroad circles to have little influence on union leaders toward averting the threatened strike next month.

PLUNGES TO HIS DEATH
Retired Business Man Leaps From Brooklyn Bridge Before Crowd
New York, June 25.—Henry Monte, general manager of Brooklyn, wealthy retired president of the New York Telephone Company, committed suicide yesterday afternoon by jumping from the East River from the middle of the Brooklyn Bridge after frustrating the efforts of nearly a hundred persons who tried to prevent him.
Monte, who had been suffering from a nervous breakdown, apparently had planned for some time to take his own life, and left detailed instructions for notifying his relatives.

Christiania, Norway, June 25.—By A. P. Roald Amundsen, the Norwegian explorer, has changed his plans for his attempt to fly to the North Pole. It was reported here today, however, that he will land at Spitzbergen, instead of Cape Colombia, as has been planned.
A Norwegian aide officer is going to Spitzbergen to mark out a suitable landing place.
