Mrs. Wilson Obtains Recipes From Ohio

Every Housewife Has Her Own Small Garden to Provide Fresh Vegetables All Summer

I HAVE just returned from a visit to the Buckeye State, Ohio, and am anxious for you to try some of the nice dishes I have seen made by the housewives of this State. The Ohio women take a real pride in their homes and in the art of cooking, and they exchange recipes with real pleasure.

Except right in the cities, it is possible for the housewife to have a garden, and this she has, growing all the reasonable products for the home table and enough to can for the winter. This does not mean that she farms; often these garden plots are not as large as our garden spaces, but they are well tilled and made to produce greens for the table.

Pickled Cabbage

Red cabbage is used for this dish. Shred as for stew one small head of red cabbage, place in saucepan and cover with boiling water, and stand on fire until water is drawn and turn on cloth to dry. Place in skillet. Two ounces of salt pork. Brown a delicate brown; now add the cabbage and

Two onions chopped fine. Toss and cover close to steam the cabbage without browning it, and when the cabbage is tender add

One-half cup of vinegar, one teaspoon of salt, one-half teaspoon of pepper, one-quarter teaspoon of mustard, Pinch of cloves, Pinch of thyme. Toss and blend well until the vinegar is absorbed; use as garnish for stews, goulashes and with fried pork chops.

Baked Cabbage

Select a firm head of cabbage and cut in thick slices the width of the head. Place the cabbage in deep crock, adding between the layers

Three onions chopped fine, One cup of finely chopped salt pork, One teaspoon of salt, One-half teaspoon of pepper. Mix well before sprinkling between the layers.

Mix two cups of sour cream with one and one-half cups of milk; turn over the prepared cabbage in the crock and bake slowly for one hour; then sprinkle the thickened bread crumbs and one-fourth cup of finely grated cheese and brown.

Marble Pudding

Select a mold about one quart, grease and flour, tapping the mold against the table to remove the excess flour. Place in mixing bowl

Two-thirds cup of sugar, One-half cup of good shortening and yolks of two eggs. Cream well and add

One and three-quarter cups of flour, One-half teaspoon of salt, Four level teaspoons of baking powder, One teaspoon of lemon extract, Juice of one lemon, One teaspoon of grated lemon rind, Three-quarters cup of milk.

Beat well, then divide the batter into three even parts; leave one part plain; to the second part add just enough red vegetable coloring to give the mixture a nice pink, and to the third part add seven tablespoons of cocoa.

Now spread a thin layer of the plain batter in the mold, then drop in first a spoonful of the pink batter, then a spoonful of the cocoa batter, and then a spoonful of the plain batter; repeat until the batter is all used. Place in the mold; do not have the mold over two-thirds full, and cover; place in hot water bath and steam about one and a quarter hours. Cover the kettle in which you are steaming the pudding closely and have the water to about two-thirds the depth of the mold. Serve this pudding with claret sauce.

Claret Sauce

Place in a saucepan

One and one-half cups of water, Three-quarters cup of grapejuice, Three-quarters cup of sugar, Three level tablespoons of cornstarch.

Stir to dissolve the sugar and the starch and bring to a boil; cook for five minutes and then add

One-half cup of seedless raisins.

Maple Cream

Place one and one-half tablespoons of gelatin to soak in one-half cup of cold water for ten minutes; now place in saucepan

One cup of maple syrup, Three-quarters cup of milk, One and one-half level tablespoons of cornstarch.

Stir to dissolve the starch and add The yolks of two eggs, One-half teaspoon of maple flavor, One teaspoon of vanilla.

Beat hard to blend and bring to boiling point; cook slowly for five minutes, then add the gelatin and whip in well; now add one-half cup of finely chopped nuts and cool. Then fold in one cup of whipped cream and turn in mold at once, chill.

This custard mixture must not start to form or set before adding the cream. If you will place the pan with the custard in cold water and whip the cream, you can then stir the custard until sufficiently cool to add the cream. This cream may be placed in fancy mold; dip mold in cold water before pouring in the mixture. Serve with either whipped cream or thin custard sauce. This amount will make two helpings for the average family.



PADDED GIRDLER




A PADDED GIRDLER is charming on a silk frock. Cut a bias piece of silk of the same material as the frock. Make it one yard longer than the length needed to go around your waist. Place a layer of sheet cotton on the wrong side of the silk and baste it down. Now line the band with a contrasting color. Measure the size needed to go around the belt. With what remains make two loops. Cut two-inch strips of the silk and line them with the same material as the lining of the girdle. Embroider these strips with bright colors. Stitch the top and bottom ends of these strips to the house. Run the PADDED GIRDLER through the embroidered band and wasten it at the side with the




