SHOPMEN STRIKE. IF PATRICI STANDS. Unions Demand Present Wages While Farming Out Work Be Stopped.

Chicago, June 28.—A strike of the 400,000 railway shopmen of the country will be called for July 1 unless the railroads agree to stay the \$600,000 wage cut due the shop workers on that date and to restore certain working conditions formerly in effect.

Decision to call a strike came after a lengthy discussion by the Executive Committee of the six shop crafts unions, based on the strike vote of the men thus far tabulated.

Should the rail heads arrange an immediate conference, agreeing meanwhile to continue present wages, the Railroad Labor Board and discontinue farming out railroad work, however, a walkout can be halted, the telegram said.

Strike Ballots Arriving. T. DeWitt Cayler, chairman of the Association of Railway Executives, threw some light on the actual strike vote.

Although the actual call for the walkout was made dependent on the railway executives' reply to Mr. Jewell's ultimatum, it is not clear that the executives would agree to such sweeping demands as those demanded by the unions.
