

RED AUTO'S NEW WARD CLUE

Car Seen Near Scene of Murder on Night of Shooting, Authorities Are Told

NEW WITNESS DISCOVERED

White Plains, N. Y., June 30.—The big red automobile, which, according to the story Walter S. Ward told the Westchester County authorities, contained the blackmailers, "Jack" and "Charley" Ross, and the night watchman, Clarence Peters, was seen by Martin Baker, of Mount Kisco, the night of the murder, waiting near the place Peters' body was found on the shore of Kenning reservoir.

Baker, who is a grocery clerk, is one witness overlooked by everybody trying to solve the case. He and his friend had been to the movie at White Plains on Friday night and on driving abreast of Kenning Dam they overtook a big maroon car in which Baker said were five or six men and a woman. Baker was returning from White Plains in his roadster, and the red car chased them for three miles. Baker thinks he was mistaken for Ward.

DRY SEAPLANE PILOT SHOT IN BATTLE WITH RUM SHIP

Takes to Air While Aides Fire Machine-Gun Volley—Boat Escapes Miami, Fla., June 30.—(By A. P.) Hubert Hubbard, pilot of a prohibition seaplane stationed here, was wounded in the hand Wednesday night in a battle with a liquor boat off Cape Florida, it was learned today. Hubbard said he was lying off the cape about 11 o'clock watching for liquor smugglers when the boat came along. In response to his command to pull in, the boat opened fire on his plane with a rifle and a shotgun, he said, one shot striking him in the hand. Hubbard took to the air and his aides opened fire with machine guns, sending nine rounds into the boat. The boat then disappeared along the cape and the men in the plane were unable to find it again. The coast guard cutter Vixie went out yesterday, but reported today it had been unable to trace the craft.
