He and his friend had been to the movies at White Plains on Friday mories at White Plains on Friday night and on driving abreast of Ken-sico Dam they overtook a big maroon car in which Baker said were five or six persons, one of whom was a woman.

As Baker drove past them they shouted to him to stop. He was frightened and sped on, the red car giving chase. sped on, the red car giving chase.

The next Sunday morning he returned and searched the place where the big car had stopped. He found a copy of a New York newspaper dated Saturday stained with what he thought might be blood and having in it a jagged hote that might have been made by a bullet. He also found a man's cap similar to what Ward said Jack and Charley wore.

The next time Baker passed the scene The next time Baker passed the scene he was returning from White Plains sgain about midnight. A big red car was parked on the roadside. Next morning Peters' body was found there.

The boat then disappeared along the cape and the men in the plane were unable to find it again. The coast guard cutter-Vidette went out yesterday, but re-ported today it had been unable to trace
