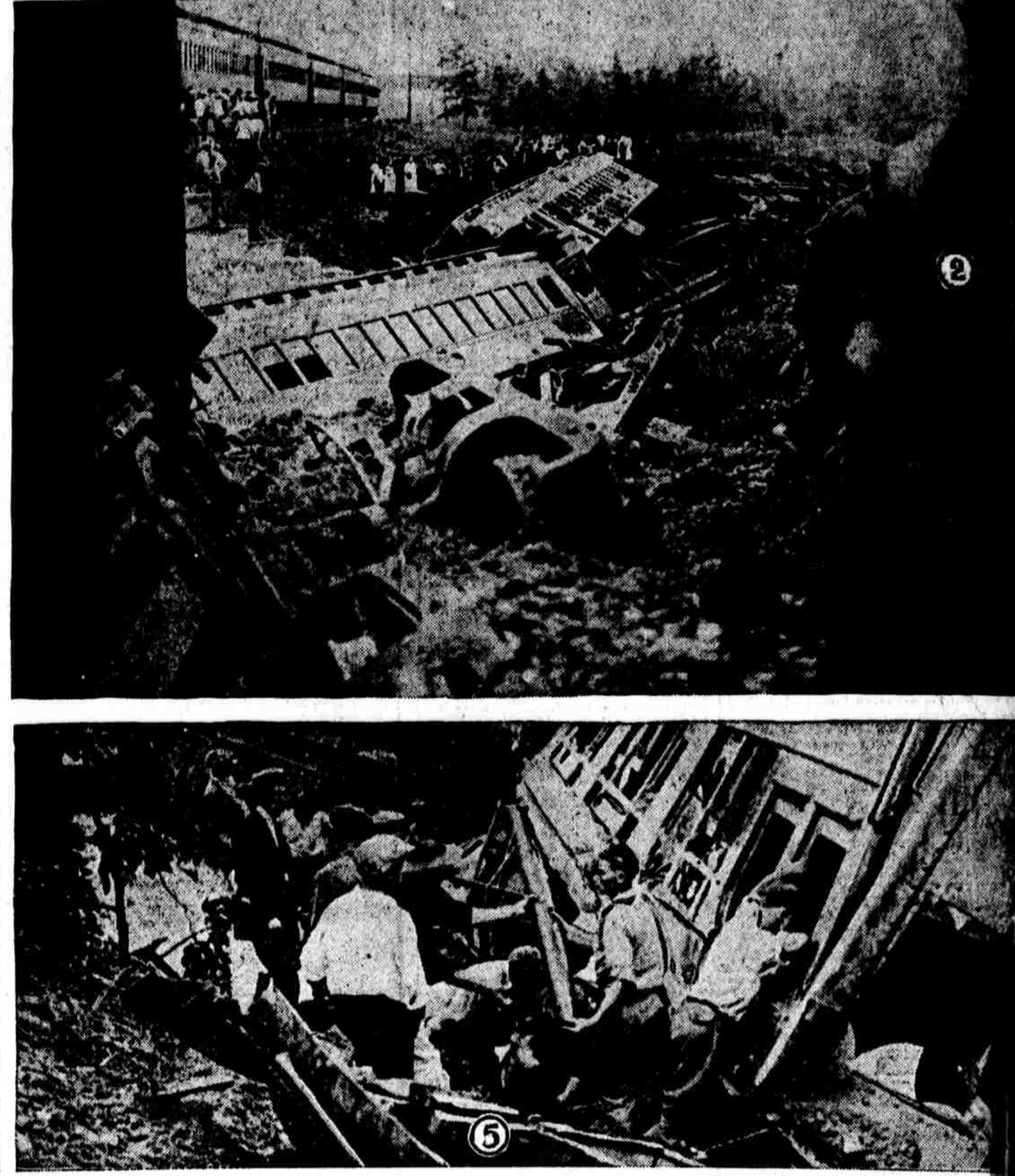


Scenes at Winslow Junction Wreck in Which Nearly Hundred Persons Were Killed or Injured



(1) General view of the fatal wreck of the Philadelphia and Reading "Owl Flier" at Winslow Junction, in which nine persons are known to have been killed, eleven are missing and seventy-two injured. The view, taken from the Reading tracks, shows the shattered cars piled in the gully between the Reading and the Pennsylvania Railroad rights of way. (2) Another general view of the wreck from the Pennsylvania Railroad right of way. (3) Rescuers searching the wreckage of the Pullman chair car, in which many persons were crushed. (4) Removing the body of the Pullman porter from the scene of the wreck after it had been recovered from the remnants of the chair car. (5) Volunteer rescuers entering wrecked coach through the windows in search of dead or injured



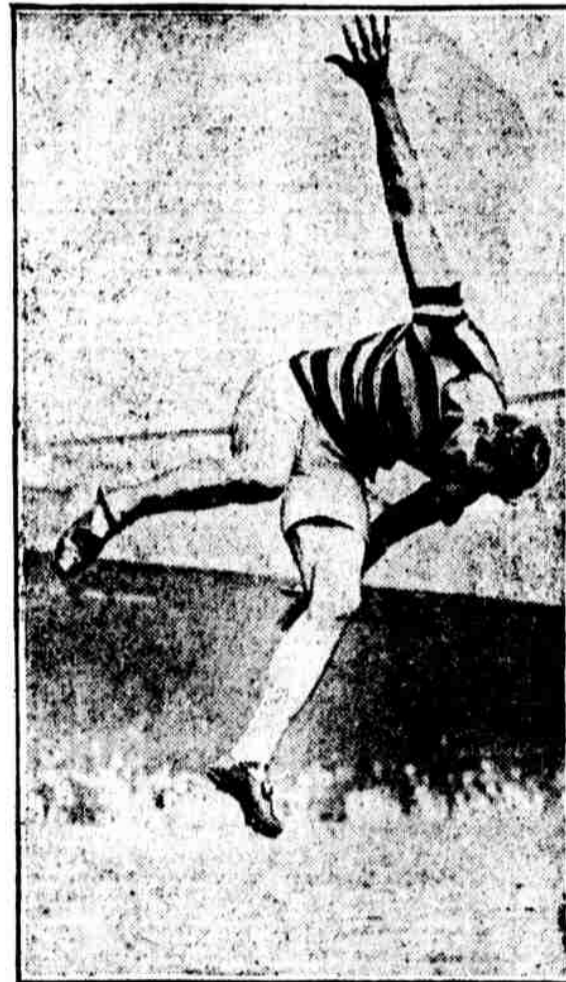

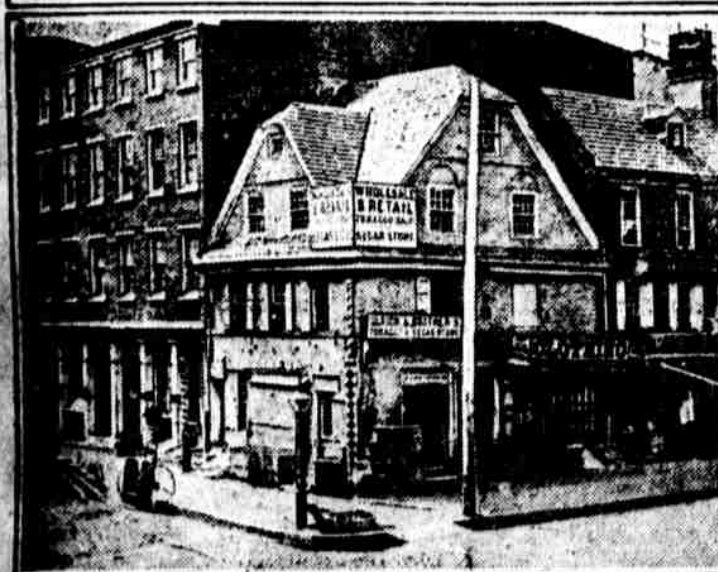

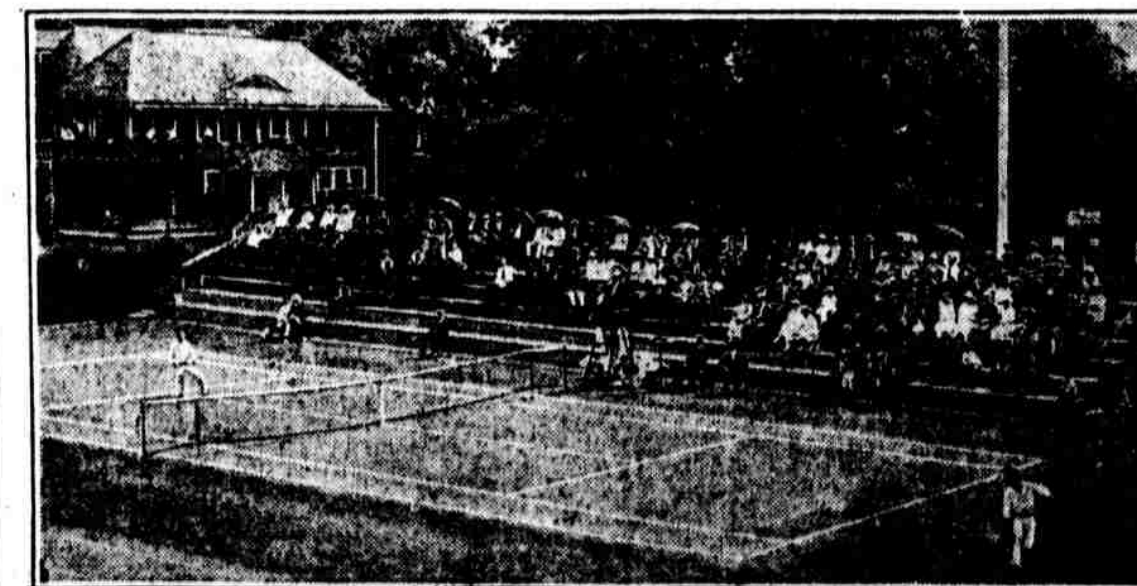
