TRAIN YOUTH FOR MARRIAGE, URGES DIVORCED SCIENTIST

A student of the institutions and habits of man in all ages and countries has failed in his own marriage because, he says, he had not been sufficiently educated for it.
There is not sufficient training for young people in preparing them for the yielding and compromises and sacrifices which are necessary in marriage, he contends.

Dr. George A. Dorsey, former professor of ethnology at Harvard, professor of anthropology at the University of Chicago, curator of anthropology at the Field Museum in Chicago, United States naval attaché during the war in Spain and Portugal, advisor on Spanish problems to the American Peace Commission at Paris, author of seventy books and papers on anthropology, has been divorced.

DANGER DISSIPATED WERNWAG FORTUNE

Olin Finney, Held in California, Said to Have Plunged in Stocks With Wife's Money

DIVORCE IS PROBABLE

A divorce suit probably will follow the arrest in San Francisco of Olin Finney, one-time dancing partner of Mrs. Vernon Castle, ex-army captain and third spouse of the former Mrs. C. Theodore Wernwag, who inherited \$2,000,000 from her second husband.

With the arrest of Finney in the apartment of Mrs. Maude Berry, 800 Geary street, came Mrs. Finney's charges that her husband squandered her fortune in stock market speculations and deserted her for another woman.

During the war he served as an officer in the aviation corps. According to friends of the Finneys, the arrest of the former army officer was the culmination of a spectacular married career of five years, during which time both parties were much in the limelight.

The couple were married in 1917 at Cold Springs Farm, Bethayres, which had been the estate of Mrs. Finney's second husband. They went to San Francisco several months ago.

Immediately after the apartment episode, Mrs. Finney departed for the Mare Island Navy Yard, where she is in seclusion with a girlhood friend, Mrs. Frank Wille, wife of Lieutenant Commander Wille, superintendent of construction at the naval base.

"Mrs. Finney is an old friend of ours," Commander Wille said. "She is suffering from a nervous strain at present, but will leave for the East in a few days. She inherited a large fortune, which was dissipated by Finney in the stock market."

"When Finney came to the coast several months ago he was virtually penniless and was supposed to be looking for a position. I know nothing of his association with the woman in whose apartment he was arrested."

When detectives went to the Locksley Hall Apartments, in the exclusive residential district, to serve a warrant sworn out by Mrs. Finney, they were first refused admittance. Finally, however, Finney agreed to accompany the officers. At the city prison he was released on bail. He will be given a hearing next week before Judge Sylvester J. McAtee on a misdemeanor charge.
