Those Not Organized for Profit Must Pay Capital Stock Tax, Hull Rules

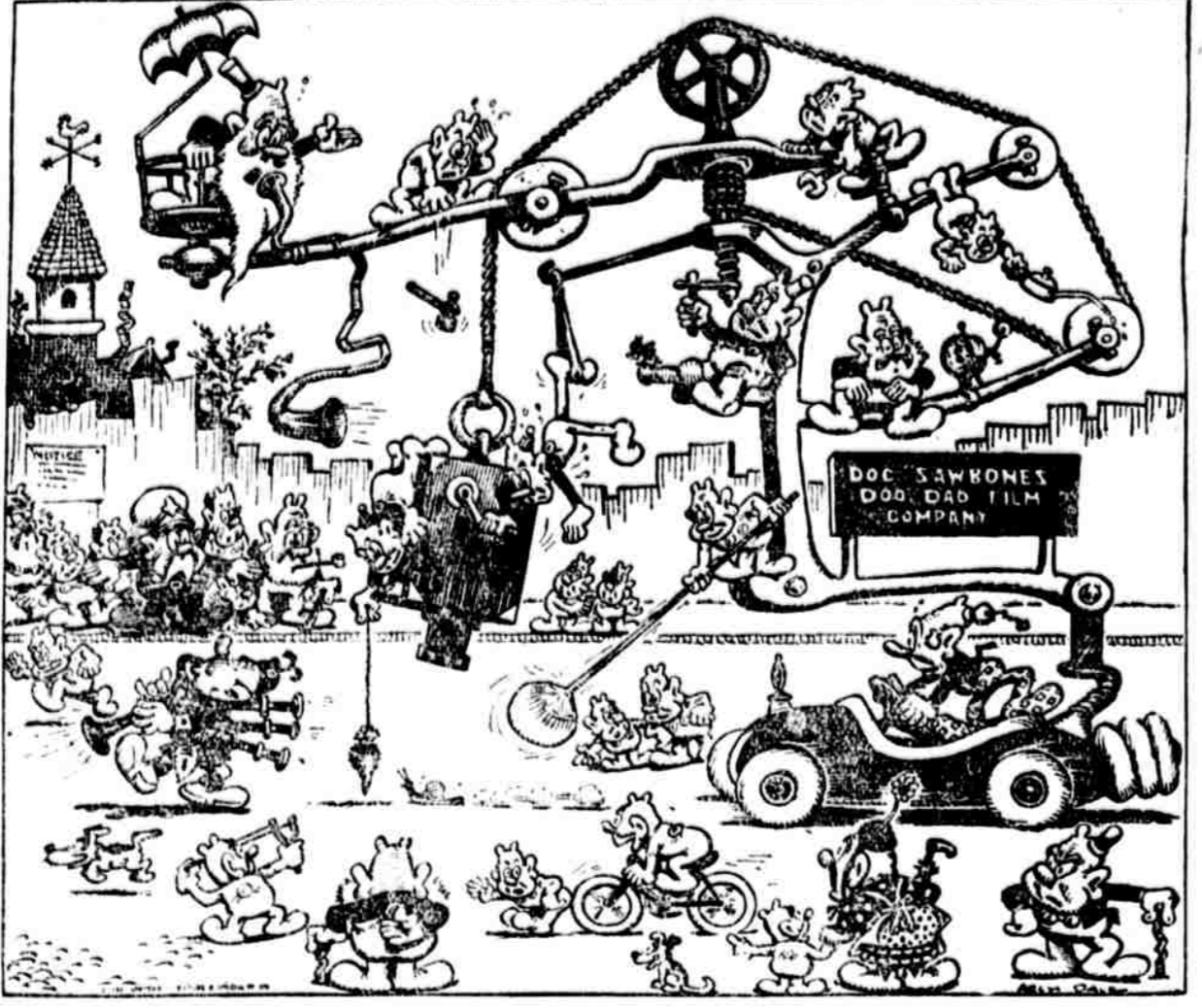
RELIGIOUS BODIES EXEMPT
