NEW ANIMALS AT ZOO

Rere Specimens Just Arrived From Australia Coming Today

New specimens of animal and bird life, which are expected to arrive at the Zoological Gardens today, will make the collection of the society the larg-est in its history. They were recently purchased by C. Emerson Brown, the superintendent, from Ellis Josephs, who is known the world over as collector and hunter of rare animals. Josephs arrived in New York last week with a shipload of animals which he captured in the wilds of Australia.

The rarest of the new arrivals is the duck-billed platypus, and if it survives the journey it will be the only one in captivity. Josephs left Australia with five in his collection, but four died en routs. In the reptile house at the Zoo can be seen two stuffed specimens of this animal. It represents the lowest order of mammal and is found only in Australia and Tasmania. It is aquatic in habit, like the muskrat, living in fresh water streams and constructing burrows in the banks. The male of the species is armed with a horny spur on each heel, connected with a poison gland on the thigh, and to be pricked by it means death for man or heast. They are shy and nocturnal animals and are rarely exhibited alive.

Four diamond pythons, ranging in length from six to eight feet, will be among the newcomers. There will also be four Australian monitors, a type of lisard, six feet in length. Several of the common kangaroo and a few of the species known as the rat kangaroo will be added to the present collection.

More color will be added in the bird house by the lilac-shouldered pigeon and a guines minoh, a much larger bird and a guinea minoh, a much large beautiful and vari-colored feathers. There will also be two pairs of silver gulls and Sidney wax bill, which resembles the finch.
