Mrs. Wharton's Study of the Enduring Qualities in Marriage

GUSTAVE FLAUBERT sought to produce by his style the effect produced by a painter. On one occasion he explained: "When writing a story I wish to convey a color shade. In 'Madame Bovary' I had only the idea of a tone, of the molly color of the life of a wood-louse."

NO ONE is likely to dispute the brilliance of Aldous Huxley. It is in his latest book, 'Mortal Coil,' (George H. Doran Company) that he has written a volume of short stories, each of which is skillfully constructed and treated in a manner of moral responsibility. He lacks for the sake of the book. The result is entertaining, but the taste for this sort of thing does not persist long.

"DICE'S RULES OF ORDER" (Stanton & Van Vleet) is a compact edition of a notably practical parliamentary manual. It contains a digest of rules and precedents and a dictionary of words and phrases, with a table answering to a glance nearly 800 questions of parliamentary procedure and practice.

BERT LESTON TAYLOR'S "The So-Called Human Race" (Alfred A. Knopf) can be recommended to readers who wish a book to pick up when they have a few minutes to spare or to read in the train. It is not a book to read at a sitting, for it is a collection of quips and humorous and cynical comment in prose and verse.
