

ANTE-NUPTIAL DEED OF ASTOR SHOWN

Settled Income of \$1,200,000
Real Estate Upon Miss Force in 1911

MOVE TO SELL PROPERTY

New York, Aug. 1.—An application yesterday by the United States Trust Company for permission to sell property owned by Colonel John Jacob Astor in West Thirty-fourth street for \$1,200,000 gave the first authentic details of the amount of the ante-nuptial agreement made upon Mrs. William K. Dick by her first husband.

The petition, filed in the county clerk's office, states that August 28, 1911, Colonel Astor entered an ante-nuptial agreement with his prospective bride, Miss Madeleine Talmadge Force, and her father, William H. Force, by which he decided to the United States Trust Company in trust the property 22-30 West Thirty-fourth street and directed that the income be paid to him during his lifetime, and, if his wife survived him, to her during her lifetime.

Colonel Astor and Miss Force were married in September, 1911, and Colonel Astor was drowned when the Titanic sank, the following April. His will, bequeathing \$100,000 outright to his wife and giving her the income from a trust fund of \$5,000,000 and use of the Astor mansion at Fifth avenue and Sixty-fifth street unless her remarriage, and leaving \$3,000,000 for his son, John Jacob, 3d, born after his death, did not dispose of the principal of the ante-nuptial trust fund.

According to the petition, it reverted to the residuary estate, which was left to Vincent Astor, Colonel Astor's son by his first wife, who was Miss Ava Willing, of Philadelphia, and who divorced him in 1910.

In the event Vincent Astor dies without issue the will provides that the residuary estate is to be divided among Colonel Astor's heirs, in which Colonel Astor's posthumous son would come in for a share of the residue.

Previous estimates of the size of ante-nuptial trust ranged all the way from \$200,000 to \$2,000,000. Mrs. Dick, widow of Colonel Astor, married William K. Dick in 1916. An interesting feature of the proceedings, in view of the recent rumors about a divorce between Vincent Astor and his wife, is the trust company's statement that Mrs. Astor's residence is in Paris. An order permitting service on her by mailing a copy of the papers to Moran, Haines & Co., in Paris, was signed by Justice Erlanger. Vincent Astor is now in this country.

Wireless Switch Starts Train
Pittsburgh, Pa., Aug. 1.—(By A. P.)—A wireless switch used here yesterday to start an engine hauling thirty-three cars of equipment for the electrification of Chilean railroads. In the presence of radio engineering experts the current was passed through the air to a specially designed controller. The train carried a portion of a \$7,000,000 Chilean contract. The shipment will proceed from Philadelphia by boat.

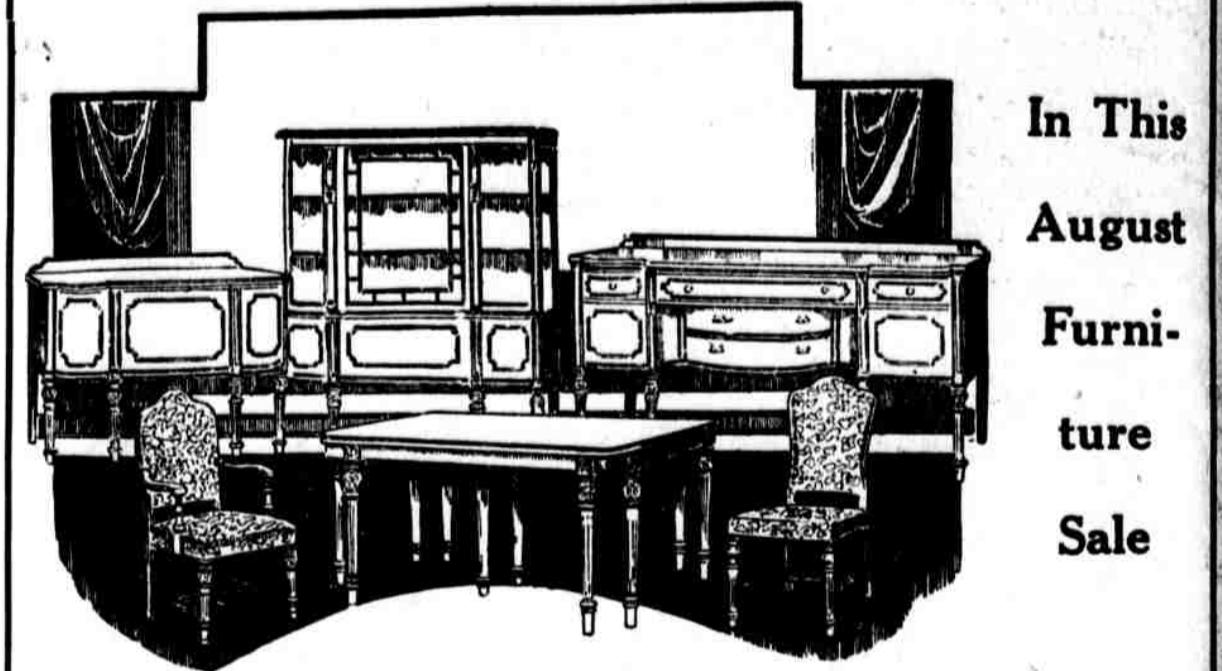

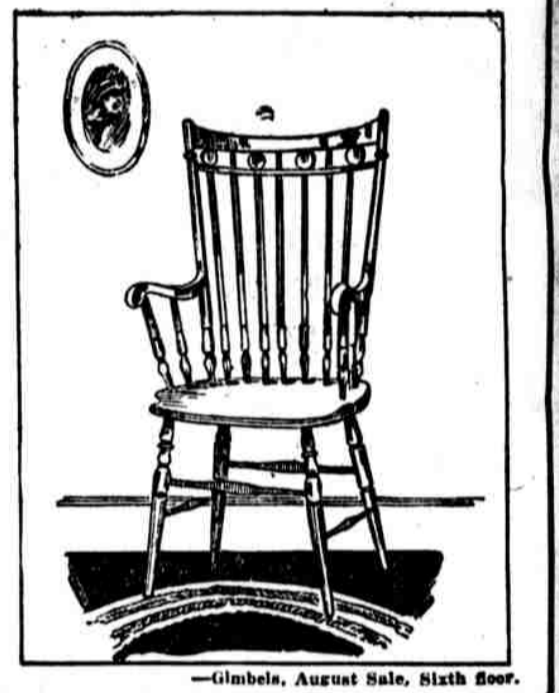
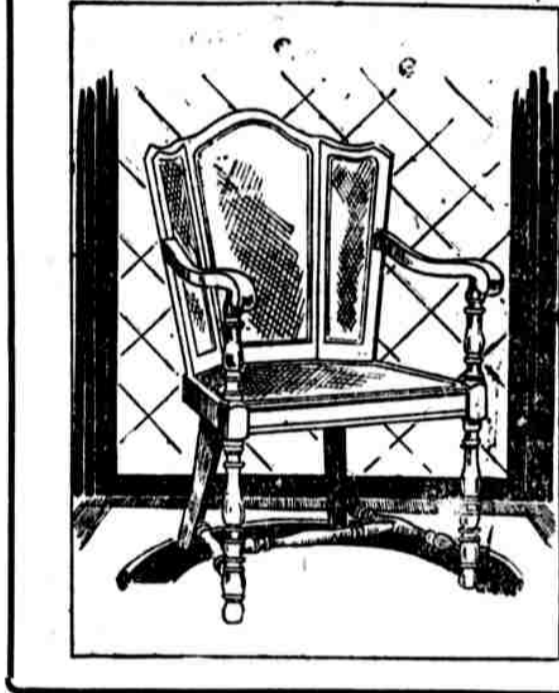
