A. Reed's lead over Breckenridge Long in the race for the Democratic nomination for United States Senator receded at noon today to 15,008 as additional country precincts, favorable to the former Assistant Secretary of State, reported from yesterday's primary election.

Returns from 2000 out of 3848 prenets in the State gave Reed 159,730 and Long 144,632. This was a loss of nearly 2000 in Reed's lead as shown at its highest point.


