Mrs. Wilson Tells of Unusual Recipes

They May Sound Familiar, but There Is Just Enough Difference to Make Them Seem Like New Dishes

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FROM almost every corner of the United States, I have gathered recipes that folks think worth while. Sometimes they have a familiar sound, but if you will study them closely you will find just a little new wrinkle, here and there, that will bring a different result from the same proportions of ingredients that may be quite familiar to you. Try some of the following and note the difference from the usual dishes.

Raisin Nut Layer Cake
Measure all flour before sifting. Place in flour sifter. Two and three-quarters cups of flour, Two-thirds cup of cocoa, One teaspoon of cinnamon, One-quarter teaspoon of nutmeg, One-half teaspoon of salt. Sift the mixture, now rub into this sifter flour.

Seven tablespoons of shortening, rubbing this shortening until the flour is fine and mealy. Place in mixing bowl. One and one-quarter cups of sugar, Yolk of three eggs. Two teaspoons of vanilla extract, One and one-eighth cup of milk. Beat well with egg beater to blend, then add flour, beating the batter until nice and smooth.

Turn into a pan of raisins cut in small pieces, One cup of chopped nuts. Beat hard to blend in the raisins and nuts, and then fold in the stiffly beaten whites of the three eggs. Turn in two well greased deep layer cake pans, spreading the batter, just a little higher on the sides than in the center; bake twenty-five minutes in moderate oven. Cool.

Place white of one egg in small bowl and add.

One-half glass of currant jelly. Whip with the rotary style of egg beater until the mixture holds its shape, then fold in one-quarter cup of confectioner's sugar that has been sifted twice. Spread lightly between the layers with jelly, then with the meringue, sprinkle thickly with finely chopped nuts, put layers together, and so on. To ice cake, cover with finely chopped nuts.

Chicken Patties
This dish is nice to use up left-over cooked chicken. It does not matter if the chicken has been boiled, fried or baked.

Place in saucepan One and one-half cups of chicken stock. This stock may be made from the left-over bones.

Three-quarters cup of milk, One-half cup of flour. Sift to dissolve the flour, and bring to boiling point. Add One and three-quarters cups of cold cooked chicken cut in small dice, One-cup of cooked peas, One-half cup of carrots cut in dice, and cooked until tender.

Two teaspoons of salt, One teaspoon white pepper, Three tablespoons of grated onion, One-half cup of finely minced parsley.

Stir well to blend, and cook slowly for one-half hour. Prepare a pastry as follows: Place in mixing bowl Two cups of flour, One-half teaspoon of salt, One level tablespoon of baking powder.

Sift twice, and rub into this flour One-half cup of shortening. And then use seven tablespoons of cold water to form a paste, roll out and use to line individual scallop dishes.

Fill with the prepared chicken mixture and place half-inch strips of the pastry across the top to form a crust. Brush with cold water, and bake in moderate oven until a nice brown. This usually requires about thirty minutes. Take from the oven and sprinkle thickly with finely chopped parsley and dust with paprika. The chicken patties are nice either hot or cold. If you intend to serve the patties cold, add to the chicken mixture, just before you place in the little pans.

One and one-half tablespoons of melted butter, and one-half cup of cold water, stirring in well to blend.

Watermelon Salad
Scrap out the red meat from ripe watermelon, slice, crisp nest of lettuce, and serve with fruit dressing.

Fruit Dressing
Juice of one lemon, Juice of one-half large orange, Two tablespoons of honey, Pinch of salt, Three tablespoons of marshmallow whip.

Blend together, and serve a teaspoonful over each salad.

After-Dinner Tricks

No. 222—The Iron Knuckles.

It is well known that a sharp blow to the knuckles is exceedingly painful. The performer, however, offers to prove that his knuckles are not susceptible and clinching his fist he brings it down with a terrific force on the edge of a wastepiece or table, without suffering the slightest injury.

This is a clever little trick, and if done rapidly will never be detected. In former days the performer would first, the performer quickly opens his fingers, so that the knuckle tips and not the knuckles strike the hard surface. The fist is immediately clinched again, and when the blow comes to a stop the performer reveals his knuckles as though they had received the force of the blow.
