DEALERS EVADE COMMENT

Johnstown, Pa., Aug. 19.—Determined to rid the city of bootleggers and to provide a "substitute for bad water," Mayor Joseph Campfield admitted today that he had told local brewers and saloon keepers that—as Mayor of Johnstown—he would have no objection to the sale of real beer.

Saloonmen were inclined to evade comment upon Mayor Campfield's declaration. They insisted they had been asked to furnish the mayor with a list of whether they intended to dispense "real beer," and thus come in contact with prohibition officials.
