MONAGHAN HOLDS 3 AS DRUG RING AIDES; BAIL PUT AT \$25,000

Prisoners Are Picked Out by Their Victims at Sensational Hearing

WOMAN SAYS ADDICTS ARE TEMPTED AT PRISON GATE

'Jew Murphy,' Hyman Cold and Joe Bolona Are Accused as Ring Leaders

Judge Monaghan, sitting as a committing magistrate, today held Joseph Weiss, alias 'Jew Murphy'; Hyman Cold and Joseph Bolona in \$25,000 bail each for the Grand Jury, as drug peddlers.

They were held after a morning's sensational testimony, the feature of which was that addicts cured at the House of Correction are not by emissaries of the 'drug ring,' who supply them with drugs free of charge so that they once more will become enslaved.

Judge Monaghan indignantly refused a request made by C. Stuart Patterson, Jr., representing one of the defendants, for a reduction of bail. Mr. Patterson argued that a person accused of second-degree murder never was held in more than \$5,000 bonds.

But to my mind is worse than murder, which to the Judge, 'They are accused of a crime from which murder excels. It would be more humane if the peddlers of habit-forming drugs would shoot a steel-jacketed bullet into the bodies of their victims rather than kill them by slow degrees with the poisons shot into their veins by hypodermics.

May Press for Indictments

'I have been informed that these men can put up \$25,000 bail if necessary. Perhaps they would be too much. But I will give them a chance to see if they can raise \$25,000.'

The woman who testified that the leaders of the drug ring pursue their work in the door of the House of Correction, and cunningly undo the work of months by a freely given vial of narcotics, is Mary Miller, the court room clerk.
