**INDIAN CHIEF ASKS JUSTICE BY RADIO**

**Strong Wolf, World War Veteran, Broadcasts Plea for Race From Station Here**

**WANTS CITIZENSHIP RIGHTS**

Chief Strong Wolf of the Indian tribe of Ojibway, assistant high priest of the American Indian Order "Pind," which numbers 100,000, will broadcast an address tonight over the Wanamaker radio.

Chief Strong Wolf, a veteran of the World War, thinks that the American Indian should have the right to vote, and his talk over the wireless tonight will be on "Citizenship for the Indian."

The order of which Strong Wolf is assistant high priest includes such men as Rodman Wanamaker and Charles A. Eastman. The tribe of which he is chief is located around the Great Lakes and extends as far north as the Hudson Bay country.

"I fought for four years and six months in the World War," said the chief. "One of my brothers was killed in action, the other died in a hospital from the effects of poison gas. Yet the Government says we cannot vote.

"People will have the impression that the Indian is a savage, and there are people in Europe who believe that to go west of Chicago is to risk one's life because of the roving bands of Redskins who lie in wait to scalp them. Some of the Indian is not a savage and the race has produced some wonderful men. We gave to the white man nearly all the vegetables that he is eating today. More than 42,000 of our race are farmers. We all want to become citizens. Why, then, can't we?"

The chief, who in English is known as Joseph Chinziquit, is a graduate of Bradford College. He also went to Cornell for a year and a half.

**MISS STILLE'S LEG BROKEN**

**Historian Meets With Accident at Her West Chester Home**

West Chester, Pa., Aug. 28.—Miss Mary I. Stille, seventy-eight, a prominent member of the Chester County Historical Society, a historian of note and a member of the Daughters of the Revolution, who took an active part in many organizations in Chester County, is in a hospital here with a broken leg, suffered by a fall early yesterday at her rooms, where she lived with a nephew.

Miss Stille was crippled from a fall several years ago, in which a hip was broken, and was alone at the time of the accident. She had descended to the first floor of the apartments, where the accident occurred, and was unable to call for assistance at the time. Her groans were heard by Connelman N. R. Rambo, who was passing, and he went to her assistance. A physician was summoned and the injured woman was rushed to a hospital, but is in a somewhat serious condition, due to her age.
