

MAY CONTEST WILL OF PARK BENJAMIN

Natural Heirs, Cut Off With \$1, Resent Bequest of Estate to Adopted Daughter

CALLS CHILDREN PARASITES

New York, Aug. 30.—The children of Park Benjamin, with the exception of Mrs. Enrico Caruso, who is in Italy, will confer here this week to decide whether to attempt an upset of the will of their father, which cut them off with \$1 each and denounced them as "parasites."

Mrs. Caruso, who went against the wishes of her father in marrying the famous tenor in 1918, will return next month from Italy. She is in accord with her brothers and sisters in their attitude toward the father's will, it is said.

It is to Mrs. Caruso's former companion and governess that most of her father's estate, estimated to exceed \$500,000, would eventually go under the terms of his will. The former governess, Anna Bolchi Benjamin, was adopted as a daughter by Mr. Benjamin in 1910, and his will, spread upon the public records yesterday, said she and given him the filial devotion denied him by his own children.

The father's adoption of Anna Bolchi, described as a young woman of striking appearance, with black hair and an olive complexion, was said to have been the cause of the estrangement of Mr. Benjamin, who was a noted patent lawyer, and his children.

The adopted daughter receives the largest cash bequest, \$90,000, provided for in the will, and in addition gets all of Mr. Benjamin's furniture, most of his paintings, books, personal effects and jewelry. The residuary estate was left to the widow, who is in a sanitarium, but upon her death, that, too, is to go to the adopted daughter.

A spokesman for the Benjamin children said that Mrs. Benjamin had never learned of the adoption of Miss Bolchi, or the fact that she was living at the family home.

Miss Bolchi, it was said, came to the Benjamin home as a companion for Miss Dorothy Benjamin, now Mrs. Caruso, and in the succeeding years the friendship between Mr. Benjamin and Miss Bolchi was exceedingly close. The heirs, it was reported today, would take the position that by virtue of such friendship she was able to exercise an influence over Mr. Benjamin which militated against his children.
