

BIG MUSICAL CLUB IS FORMED AT PENN

All Minor Organizations at University Are Merged Into Larger Body

YEAR'S TRIPS PLANNED

With the incorporation of the courses in music at the University of Pennsylvania into the School of Fine Arts, a new club, called the Musical Club, has been organized.

Dr. H. Alexander Matthews, composer, organist and choir leader at St. Luke's Epiphany Church, and director of the Choral Art Society, will be the director. Associated with him in charge of the instrumental clubs will be Richard L. Weaver, who has had a wide success as an orchestra leader at Allentown, Philadelphia, Bryn Mawr, Haverford and other colleges.

The Musical Club will unite all of the small musical units at the University and have charge of the Glee Club, Symphony Orchestra, University Band and the choruses.

The itinerary of the club this year includes Lancaster, Harrisburg, York, Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Buffalo, Rochester, Scranton, Wilkes-Barre and Allentown. There will also be week-end trips to Baltimore, Washington, Bryn Mawr, Atlantic City and Haverford. These trips will be taken by all the groups in the Musical Club with the exception of the band, which will give a series of concerts during the year as well as playing at all athletic events.

The club's Philadelphia concerts will be given at the Academy of Music on November 20 and January 31. The latter will be a joint concert with Princeton. The concert will be followed by a dance in the foyer of the Academy.

The Choral Art Society will give a concert in the University gymnasium on October 28 under the direction of the Musical Club, in order to give the students an idea of what Dr. Matthews hopes to accomplish with the student choruses.

A fund has been established by a member of the club, the interest of which will be used annually as a prize in a student competition for new Pennsylvania songs.

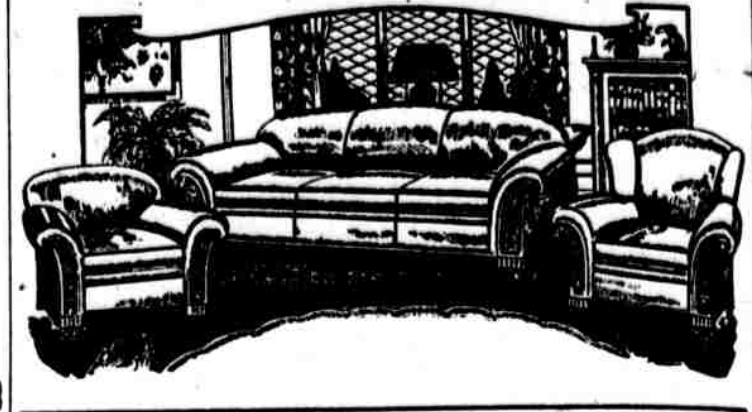
