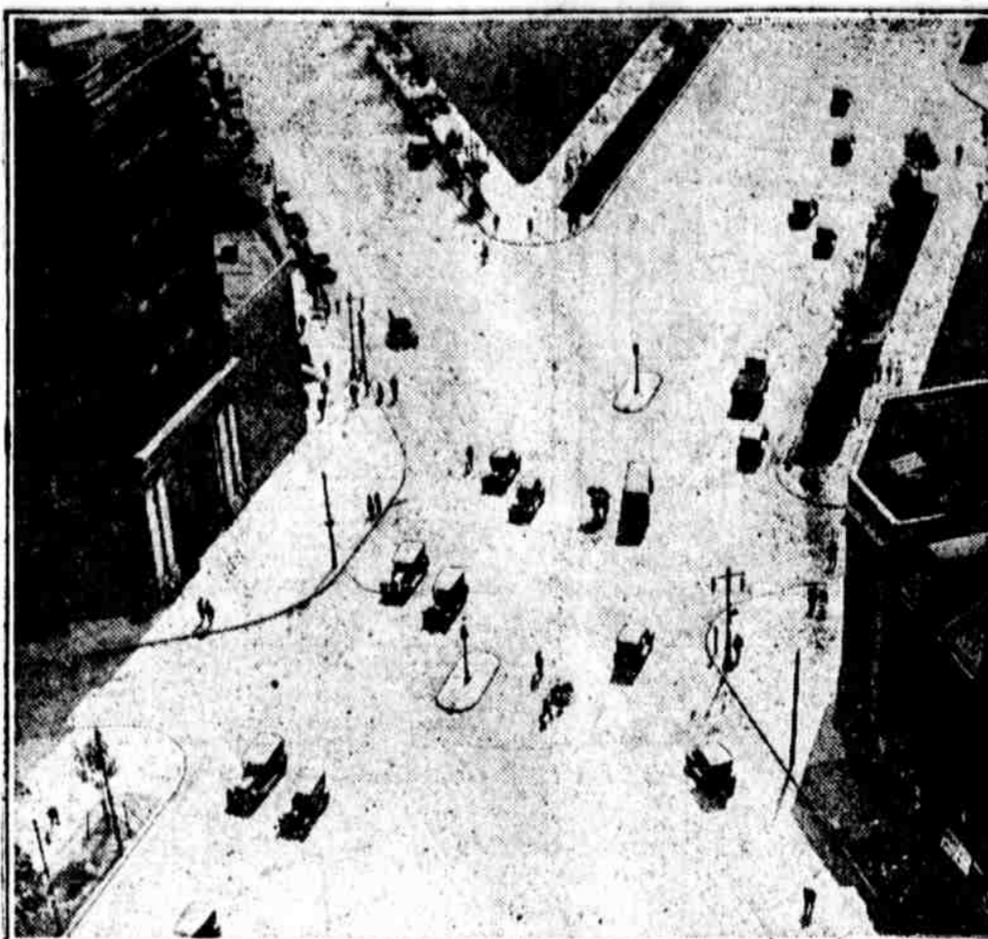

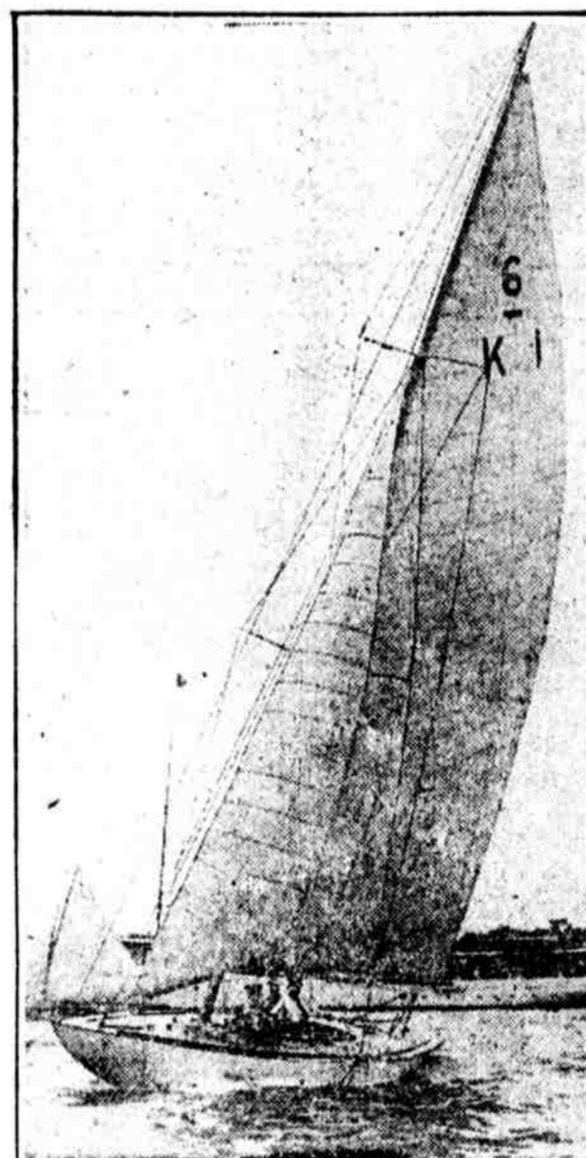

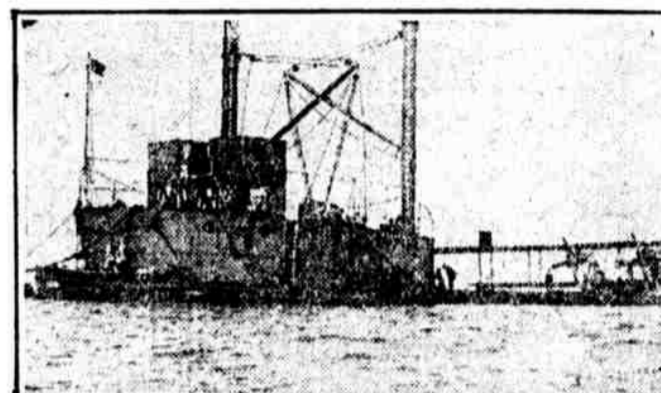

FLOATING SEAPLANE DOCK. This is the latest addition to the equipment of the British Navy. The repair hangar takes up most of the dock space



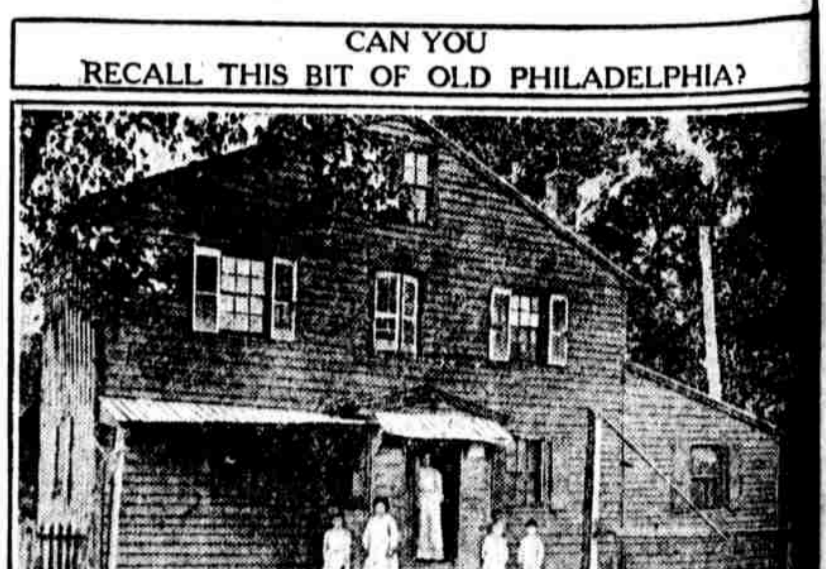
REFUSED TO DANCE WITH KING. Irene Bordoni and King Alfonso of Spain met at Deauville
