

### HARRISON QUILTS CHAIR AT U. OF P.

Designation of Chairman of Trustees Will Place Randal Morgan in Chair

Dr. Charles Curtis Harrison has resigned as chairman of the Board of Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania. He had been chairman of the board since the resignation of Dr. Edgar P. Smith, provost, and a trustee of the University for the last six years.

Harrison's office at 400 Chestnut street, made the announcement of the resignation which was tendered at the last meeting of the board. In commenting on Dr. Harrison's resignation, Mr. C. Bell, another trustee, said: "Dr. Harrison wished to be relieved of the arduous duties attached to the chairmanship of the Board of Trustees," said Mr. Bell, "and tendered his resignation as chairman at the last meeting of the board. I believe that the trustees respect Dr. Harrison's wishes in this matter and accept his resignation. In this event, the rule of seniority of the board will place Randal Morgan in the chair."

Dr. Harrison has always been intensely interested in the welfare of the University and continues to devote much of his time and energy to it, but he feels that the duties which devolve upon him as chairman of the board are a little too arduous for him at the present time. There has been no suggestion that he will resign from the board and he has no doubt that he will continue to be actively interested in all the affairs of the University.

Dr. Harrison was provost of the University from 1895 until 1910, when he resigned. In the absence of a provost, the senior member of the board automatically becomes its chairman, which now falls to Mr. Morgan.

### DELAWARE BOY DISAPPEARS

Failed to Return Home After Visiting His Grandfather Here

Disappearing from the home of his grandfather, William F. Vaughan, of 6233 Pechell avenue, on August 27, a thirteen-year-old Rowland G. Vaughan, son of S. W. Vaughan, of Georgetown, Del., has not yet been found.

All police stations in this city have been notified and furnished with his description. Navy and marine enlistment stations have been interrogated, but no information has been secured.

Young Vaughan is five feet four inches in height and dressed in a brown suit and brown felt hat. He wore tortoise-shell glasses.

### URGE TERMINALS HERE

Air, Water, Rail and Automobile Facilities Planned

The establishment of a large freight terminal on the outskirts of the city which would be of sufficient size to cope with the combined air, water, rail and motortruck freight services of the future was urged at a meeting of the Philadelphia Traffic Association in the City Club last night.

The construction of the terminal on the outskirts was urged in order to avoid the congestion of the central business districts. A resolution was unanimously passed pledging the active support of the association for ten years to C. B. Dill, secretary of the Engineers' Club here in Philadelphia, who is working to bring about the erection of such a terminal.

### ENGINE FIREMAN HURT

Believes Obstruction on Passing Train Knocked Him Down

Hosea King, a Reading Railway fireman, was found unconscious on the floor of a locomotive cab at 7:30 A. M. today when the engineer noted that the bell had not been rung near the Manayunk station on the Norristown branch.

King was revived in the Memorial Hospital. He said a northbound work train passed his southbound local above Norristown and that something may have projected from it, which threw him to the floor of the cab. His head was not injured, but he was severely bruised about one hip. King is twenty-eight years old and lives at 118 East Chestnut street, Norristown.
