William C. Harding Hit by Speeding Car on White Horse Pike Near Elm

William C. Harding, of 5636 Apple tree street, this city, was killed before the eyes of his wife and six-year-old son on the White Horse pike at Elm, N. J., at midnight, when a machine in which a naval officer and some Philadelphia society people were riding struck him when he was changing a tire.

DRIVER OF MOTOR ARRESTED

Victim Was Changing Tire on Road When Other Vehicle Dashed By in Dark

The car which killed Mr. Harding was owned and driven by John Brennan, 1510 Latimer street, a professional chauffeur, who lets out cars to members of the Racquet Club. He is under arrest in Camden. The other passenger in the party were the late Camden with Brennan by Corporal Campbell of the New Jersey State Police, and released in \$500 bail to appear if wanted.

Was Flinging Auto Tire

In Mr. Harding's lawyer's wife and daughter, O. Menzies, prominent Philadelphia lawyer, whose home is at 5607 Locust street, and the Misses E. O. and E. Hahn, of Trenton. Mr. Menzies owns the car.

Women Become Hysterical

State police were summoned. Mr. Harding was beyond aid. His skull had been fractured and he had died almost instantly. The women in the party were hysterical. The police took Brennan to the station and took the car to County Detectives Doran and Smith. They were taken to the courthouse and questioned by Assistant County Prosecutor Burling.

LAST-MINUTE NEWS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—The condition of Mrs. Harding, wife of the President, critically ill at the White House, was reported at 9:30 A. M. today to be "as favorable as can be expected at this time."

A bulletin issued by Brigadier General C. E. Sawyer, physician in attendance, said:

"Mrs. Harding had a fairly good night. The complications of yesterday are less threatening this morning. On the whole her condition is as favorable as can be expected at this time."

IRISH NATIONALS AMBUSHED

DUBLIN, Sept. 9.—A patrol of four national army men proceeding toward Ballsbridge Bridge near the Clifden wireless station, County Galway, was ambushed by forty irregulars, whose intention it apparently was to cut off the Maroon station garrison from its base. The patrol, however, took cover and held its position until reinforcements arrived, when the irregulars took flight. Four of them were captured with quantities of arms, ammunition and bombs.

GARY IN CONFERENCE ON COKE REGION PEACE
