

MAN SHOTS WIFE, BABY AND HIMSELF

Neighbor, Clad Only in Underclothes, Dashes Through Street to Hospital With Child

COUPLE WERE SEPARATED

Enraged by her threat to divorce him, Harry Troet took shot and seriously wounded his wife Sophie, sent a bullet into the arm of their three-year-old child, whom she was holding, and then shot himself.

The triple shooting occurred in the hallway at 510 Parrish street, where the wife boarded after separating from Troet several weeks ago. They had lived at 610 North Hancock street.

Troet fired at close range, one bullet piercing his wife's abdomen and another entering her thigh. He then aimed the weapon at his stomach and fired. A belt buckle deflected the bullet into his left arm.

Barley conscious from her wounds, Mrs. Troet's mother rushed to her and carried her wounded child to the front steps after the husband had fled from the house. She laid the child down carefully and then collapsed.

Troet was brought home by the police. He was taken to the Roosevelt hospital a few minutes after his wife and child arrived there.

Mrs. Lida McFarlan, 508 Parrish street, ran to the front window of her home when she heard the shots. She saw the child on the sidewalk and ran out shouting to carry it into her own home.

A homicide at 510 Parrish street, dressed only in underclothes, ran out at the moment and seized the baby. He ran with it to the hospital, waiting for him to speak, he began to cry.
