NOMINATE PADEREWSKI

Planist Named to Oppose Pilsudski in Polish Presidential Election

Warsaw, Sept. 18.—By A. P. — The presidential contest in Poland the coming November apparently will be between Marshal Joseph Pilsudski, the present chief of state, and Ignace J. Paderewski. The candidature of Paderewski has been announced by the National Democratic party, the party of national independence, in disregard of the party's declaration that he had retired from politics.

The Pilsudski candidature is sponsored by the present party led by General Przemysl Wlodek, the Socialists.

Paderewski has several times recently returned to a statement that he had retired from politics. At the same time he was in Switzerland practicing his profession in preparation for his concert tours in the United States, to begin in November.

CHURCH WAR OVER ORGAN

Instrument Destroyed Soon After Being Installed

Henderson, Ky., Sept. 18.—(By A. P.)—The Christian Church at Henderson, Union County, recently installed an organ after a several months' wrangle among the congregation. Today a notice of excommunication was issued against the organ, which had been removed from the church, because of the church's refusal to accept it. Mrs. Upper's scalp was torn off. Her upper drove out on a visit and Mrs. Upper stayed outside near the bear, which was chained. He broke the chain and sprang on her. Upper rushed to her and the bear turned on him. He was badly mangled and had his leg broken before the bear was shot.

20 YEARS TAMMANY HEAD

Charles F. Murphy Notes Anniversary as Leader of Regime

New York, Sept. 18.—(By A. P.)—Charles F. Murphy today observed the twentieth anniversary of his regime as leader of Tammany Hall.

This is the longest period any leader has retained control of the organization in the 133 years of its existence, and during that time Murphy is credited with having won five university elections, named three Governors and one United States Senator.

PREDICTS ELECTION FOR THREE WOMEN

Mrs. Upton Says There Soon Will Be Ten in Congress

NAME N. Y. CANDIDATES

New York, Sept. 18.—Three Republican women nominees for Congress stand a good chance of election, Mrs. Harriet Taylor Upton, of Ohio, vice chairman of the Republican National Executive Committee, said on arrival yesterday for a conference with Charles D. Hillis, national committeeman.

"Three women are not enough in Congress," Mrs. Upton said. "I'd like to see ten. But there'll be three in time." The women members of the National Committee desire to see Miss Alice Robertson, of Oklahoma, returned to the House.

Another nominee is Mrs. Winifred Mason Hill, of Chicago, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of her father, Representative William F. Mason, of Illinois. She will have little opposition. Mrs. Lindsay Patterson, who is a Republican candidate from the Fifth Congressional District of North Carolina, is making a hard personal campaign against tremendous odds.

Albany, Sept. 18.—Enrolled Republican and Democratic voters will go to the polls today to elect numerous primary candidates for congressional, state, senate and assembly nominations. Rival candidates concluded their campaigns yesterday.

State officers, United States Senators and candidates for state judicial offices are to be nominated at official state conventions next week.

Primary voting is not expected to be heavy, except in congressional districts where prohibition enforcement has been made the outstanding issue. In six of the congressional districts north of the Bronx, where there are contests for the allied "dry" forces have endorsed candidates and are actively supporting them.

REICHSBANK BACKS BONDS TO MEET REPARATIONS

German Minister Tells Belgians 270,000,000 Marks Will Be Paid

Brussels, Sept. 18.—By A. P. — Dr. Landberg, the German Minister here, informed the Belgian Government this morning that the Reichsbank was making a loan of 270,000,000 marks to meet the reparations payments to Belgium to the amount of 270,000,000 marks, due February 15 and June 15, 1923.

Dr. Landberg's action, which is taken here to compose the differences between Belgium and Germany on reparations payments, is regarded in Belgian quarters as the first, yet preliminary, attitude of the Belgian Government.

This action in Germany was regarded as a decisive move, which, it is reported, Dr. Landberg, president of the Reichsbank, had arranged to guarantee for the payment of the reparations. The reparations were to be issued by Germany in Belgium. The understanding was that the Bank of England and probably a Dutch bank would loan the Reichsbank the money to meet the payment of the reparations. The Reichsbank in turn reported the German banks in Belgium to meet the reparations.

SWARTHMORE OPENS TODAY; MANY CHANGES IN FACULTY

New Department of Fine Arts to Be Headed by Prof. A. M. Brooks

The opening today of Swarthmore College finds a number of important additions and changes in force among the faculty members.

The newly created department of fine arts at Swarthmore will be headed by Alfred Mansfield Brooks, formerly professor of fine arts in Indiana University, where he was 500 students in the college this year. The incoming class numbers 170.
