

BISHOPS CONDEMN KU KLUX OUTRAGES

Concur With Episcopal Deputies in Denouncing Klan and Mob Rule

"SOCIALIST BISHOP" NAMED

Portland, Ore., Sept. 19.—(R. T. Rev. Paul Jones, formerly Bishop of Utah, and known as the Socialist Bishop, yesterday was nominated as missionary Bishop of Eastern Oregon. The nomination was made in the House of Bishops by Bishop Benjamin Brewster of Maine, who is one of the leaders of advanced social movements in the Episcopal Church.

Other nominations were W. P. Remington, now Suffragan Bishop of South Dakota; the Revs. Drs. W. A. Goodwin, of Rochester, N. Y.; Benjamin D. Dagwell, Pueblo, Colo.; Edward M. Cross, St. Paul, Minn.; Thomas Jenkins, Portland, Ore.; and J. Walter Graham, dean of the cathedral of San Francisco. Dean Graham was nominated by the presiding Bishop, Daniel S. Tuttle. He declined his election as missionary Bishop of the Philippine Islands three years ago.

The nomination of Bishop Paul Jones has aroused considerable comment, as he has resigned his jurisdiction of Utah in 1918 because of his views on social questions and on the war. He remains a Bishop without jurisdiction and with a seat and vote in the House of Bishops, but he is not attending the convention. The indications point to the election of Bishop Remington, as his nomination was seconded by thirty Bishops.

The Bishop concurred with the deputies in the adoption of resolutions condemning mob violence, lynch law, the Ku Klux Klan and the marriage of physical and mental defectives.

By an overwhelming majority the deputies rejected the amendment to the constitution which would permit the election of women as deputies in the General Convention.

Increasing of women as lay readers in the Protestant Episcopal Church was approved last night by the House of Deputies. The deputies voted 206 to 127 to adopt a canon amendment, which remains to be acted upon by the House of Bishops, after the Rev. Dr. Edwin A. White, of Newark, N. J., said that the innovation would help the church in the mountain regions of the South, where clergymen are not always available. The women will be authorized to render part of the church service.

The deputies squelched an attempt to insert at the end of the burial service in the prayer book a rubric forbidding the reading of the burial services over unburied and excommunicated persons. This had been rejected earlier in the day.

The deputies adopted new prayers for a sick child and for women. Prayers for the dead were accepted without challenge. After considerable discussion the budget and program of the presiding Bishop and council were accepted. It calls for a fund during the next three years of \$20,500,000. Of that amount, \$12,000,000 is for the maintenance of existing work and the balance for church extension.

General approval to the efforts of moving picture producers for better films was given and a committee was appointed to consider the whole question and report to the next convention. The election will take place today after a celebration of the Holy Communion, and the names of the successful candidates will be sent to the House of Deputies for confirmation.

SIXTEEN IRISH KILLED IN COUNTY MAYO FIGHT

Dail President Gets Leave to Present Bill Embodying Constitution

Dublin, Sept. 19.—(R. T. P.)—Ten Republicans and six Nationalists were shot dead in a fierce conflict at Erris in Northern County Mayo, when the Republicans, retreating from Ballina, were attacked by government troops. The military were at a disadvantage in that they had no machine-guns and they suffered severely in the earlier stages of the fight. Later their complete numerical superiority took a heavy toll from the Republicans.

Brigadier General Neary, with a small party, was cut off from the main body and captured, but overpowered his captors and escaped. The commander of the troops narrowly avoided capture.

Three Nationalists and one Republican were killed and others wounded when a small party of troops was ambushed in County Tipperary Sunday morning.

A missed attack by the Republicans on Roslinduff, County Limerick, resulted in the capture of the outposts, which was set on fire by its garrison. One of the Nationalists lost his life in the fire.

Dublin, Sept. 19.—(R. T. P.)—Leave to introduce a bill for amending a constitution for the Irish Free State was granted at yesterday's session of Parliament. William Cosgrave, President of the Dail, in asking permission to introduce the bill, said the measure combined the best elements to be found in the constitutions of other nations.

UPLIFT IN MOORESTOWN

The Sunday school will be held at 10 A. M. in the high school, on the lawn of the Friends' Meeting House. A baby show also is being arranged.

NEW EVENING HIGH SCHOOL OPENED IN KENSINGTON

Sessions to Be Held Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays

A new evening high school for men and women was opened last night at the Kensington High School, as the sessions of the city evening schools started the new term. The sessions are held every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 7:30 to 9:15.

Last year the enrollment in the evening high schools was 15,048 and in the evening elementary schools 4724. It is expected this year's enrollment will exceed that amount by at least 20 per cent.

The evening high schools are as follows: Central (men and women), Broad and Green streets; Annex No. 1, Broad and Green streets; Annex No. 2, Seventeenth and Wood streets; Frankford (men and women), Oxford avenue and Harrison streets; Germantown (men and women), Germantown avenue and High street; Kensington (men and women), Coral and Cumberland streets; Northeast (men and women), Eighth street and Lehigh avenue; South Philadelphia (men and women), Broad and Jackson streets; West Philadelphia (men and women), Forty-eighth and Walnut streets; William Penn (women), Fifteenth and Wallace streets.
