

CONCORDAT TOPIC OF EPISCOPALIANS

House of Bishops Considers Ordination of Congregational Pastors

ENTERS FEDERAL COUNCIL

Portland, Ore., Sept. 21.—The concordat, declared by those who advocate it as a movement in the interest of church unity, was before the House of Bishops today for final action. This proposed agreement with the Congregational Church provides for the ordaining by Episcopal bishops, under certain conditions, of ministers of the Congregational Church who may ask for such ordination.

To make the concordat effective adoption of a canon will be necessary. Already both houses of the convention have adopted a change in the constitution of the Church which will make possible the putting into effect of the concordat.

The House of Bishops has voted to make the Church a member of the Federal Council of Churches.

The Rev. William P. Remington, newly Suffragan Bishop of South Dakota, was elected Moderator of the House of Bishops, who resigned last week. He is one of the youngest members of the House of Bishops having been born in Philadelphia March 13, 1870. He was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania and studied for the ministry at the Virginia Theological Seminary.

DIVORCE TRAIL ACROSS U. S.

Woman Recites Her Marital Experiences in Many States
New York, Sept. 21.—(By A. P.)—Supreme Court Justice Marsh has declined to hear a suit for separation brought by Mrs. Betty Schuller against her third husband, Charles P. Schuller. Mrs. Schuller told the court she was born in Missouri, married her first husband there and then she moved and married the second one in Georgia and divorced him in West Virginia. Then she moved to Texas, met Schuller while visiting in New Orleans, married him in Pennsylvania, and has been living with him in New Jersey.

Justice Marsh denied New York had nothing to do with the case, although Mrs. Schuller and she heard her husband "once lived in Greenwich Village."

'Girl' Dancer, Who Shocked Clergy, Proved to Be Boy

Portland, Ore., Sept. 21.—(By A. P.)—When "A Stunner Beloved," a pageant presented under the auspices of the Drama Commission of the church, was repeated at the Auditorium last night to a packed house, the leading dancer in a band of votaries of the god Baal-Ash-toreth was not in the cast. Protest had been made by clergymen attending the convention that the dancer, who led a band of bare-legged maidens in a dance during the first production of the pageant, was immodest, and the dancer was ordered out of the performance by Dr. W. E. Gardner, head of the educational department of the church, under which the Drama Committee operates.
