

SAYS AMERICANS WERE HUMILIATED

Herded With Aliens in Unclean Island at New York, Charges Squire Dugdale

RAPS IMMIGRATION MEN

American-born men and women passengers on the White Star liner Baltic were "humiliated and outraged" and placed in the position of "illegitimate foreigners" by the action of New York immigration officials in herding them together with other foreign passengers and transporting them to the domestic station on Hoffman Island, according to Squire Dugdale, president of the National American Immigration League.

Mr. Dugdale returned from Liverpool on the Baltic and witnessed the scene aboard ship on Sunday that followed orders of the health authorities to take all third-class passengers to Hoffman Island.

The protest of the 107 Americans were so emphatic that attention was called to the case by the British consul general in New York, Arthur Pollock.

Mr. Dugdale, speaking from the Baltic last night after spending the day on Hoffman Island, said that 450 American third-class passengers were

called Hoffman Island Unclean. "The third-class Americans were crowded into a filthy, unclean, and unhygienic island," he said.

Protest Arbitrary Action. "The arbitrary action of the immigration officials in herding Americans with aliens and transporting them to Hoffman Island is a disgrace to the United States," he said.
