

BLACK TIES FOR U. OF P. FRESHMEN

Somber Hue Befits Moribund Brains, Declare Sophomores, Who Enjoin Obedience

NEW RULES ON POSTERS

The campus at the University of Pennsylvania, which remains Friday, is ornamented today with large posters which sophomores confidently believe will strike terror in every freshman heart.

It is the recurrent "open season" for the poster class, and erin sophomore "phantoms" are prowling about the campus looking for youths of verdant men who neglect to cover their craniums with the acceptable "ink spot," or who sport red socks or flashy ties.

What may happen to them is illustrated graphically in the poster, which shows a staid freshman being whaled by a well-dressed club into the luminous shadows of the "frog pond."

Styles change, even for freshmen, and this year's regulations enjoin upon them the wearing of "regulation black cloth ties." Blue ties were the thing last year. Black caps, black socks and black shoes, constituting this year's sartorial symphony for freshmen, are symbolic of the moribund if not entirely dead condition of their brains, in the opinion of their elders, the sophomores.

This year, as usual, each freshman will get a "students' manual," better known as the "Freshman's Bible," but as an epitome of this useful tome the sophomores have condensed the freshman's rule of life into ten "commandments," set forth on the posters.

Punishment for Violations
Violation of the rules entails the punishment, which may take the form of a frog pond ducking in the Botanical Gardens, or the milder form of being forced to make a speech on what subject it may best please the sophomores to hear their victim's eloquence. The sophomore class will give a reception to the freshman class tomorrow evening.

At 7:30 the "fresh" will assemble in the quadrangle of the dormitories at Thirty-seventh street and Woodland avenue. Headed by the retiring president of the sophomore class, Frank R. Bailey, they will march in a body from building to building on the campus. Bailey will be assisted by members of the Phi Kappa and Sigma Tau, senior honorary societies.

The freshmen will line up at each building and will be told its history. When the tour has ended the yell of the class of 1923 will be taught the freshmen. Each class has its particular yell. The "fresh" will then proceed to Weighman Hall, where every one will be forced to kiss the foot of Benjamin Franklin's statue which is in front of the gymnasium. They will then enter the gymnasium and meet the sophomores.

During last year's reception a corps of sophomores were busily operating electric clippers on the head of each freshman. The electric clippers cut a swath the width of the clippers down the side of the "fresh's" hair. The nature of the first greeting for this year's class is not known, but it pays every freshman to attend the reception. After the first greetings are over the two classes usually proceed to Franklin Field and under the glare of arc lights interclass wrestling matches, tug-of-war contests and other features are held.

As the new stadium at Franklin Field is not quite completed, the interclass contests will probably take place on the field in front of the Commercial Museum this time.
