

\$45,000 MORE FOR DIER CREDITORS

U. S. Court Orders Building Stock Held by C. J. Eisenlohr Returned as Assets

WAS GIVEN AS COLLATERAL

Creditors of the E. D. Dier & Co., failed brokerage house, will get \$45,000 more as a result of a decision of Judge Dickinson in United States District Court.

The decision was in the action of Manfred W. Purich, trustee in bankruptcy, brought by Clarence Loeb, auxiliary receiver in this district, against Charles J. Eisenlohr, who loaned Dier \$45,000 about the time that the firm went into bankruptcy.

Eisenlohr received as security, stock representing the ownership of the New York office of Dier & Co. and 200,000 shares of stock in the El Progresso Mining Company.

Judge Dickinson yesterday ordered the return of the building stock to the trustee on the grounds that it was transferred after the bankruptcy.

The auxiliary receiver found on his investigation the assets of the defunct brokerage firm, that Eisenlohr had made two loans of \$25,000 and \$20,000 to Dier just preceding the bankruptcy. Subsequently he made a third loan of \$45,000 after the bankruptcy.

The auxiliary receiver investigated the transactions and discovered that while Eisenlohr held the 200,000 shares of mining stock as collateral security for the loans, a further amount of \$45,000 was transferred to the building stock to him.

Mr. Loeb was accused of having further discovered that the same building stock was made on the day after Dier & Co. was declared bankrupt in New York. To the trustee's amazement the auxiliary receiver found that the building stock was sold by Progresso Mining New York to Eisenlohr's attorney before the trustee's receiver was being appointed.

On the hearing in bankruptcy court, Purich of Dier & Co. testified that the building stock was sold to Eisenlohr by further transfer to him after the firm collapsed. The trustee's receiver sold for \$27,000 the building stock to Loeb and the attorney for the trustee in bankruptcy offered to buy Dier's of the \$45,000 loan if he would return the building stock to the trustee and also transfer his \$25,000. This offer was refused by Eisenlohr and he was dismissed of the building stock.

The effect of the trustee's receiving the building stock was the return of the larger loans to the trustee, as well as the ownership of stock of the building.

It is held that the \$45,000 loan was made after the bankruptcy and is not a valid claim against the assets.
