50 NATIONALITIES ENROLL AT U. OF P.

Siamese Prince Among the 200 Foreigners Listed Among the Various Departments

INCREASE OF 50 OVER 1921

Fifty nations are represented this year at the International Students House of the University of Pennsylvania at 2307 Spruce street.

More than 200 foreign students have enrolled in the various departments of the University of Pennsylvania, an increase of fifty over last year's enrollment.

Of the European countries, France, Italy, Greece, Rumania, Lithuania, Latvia and Norway each has two representatives in the various departments of the University.

Seven men from seven countries comprise South America's quota, with Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Peru, Bolivia, Uruguay each having a single representative.

China, with fifty men, has sent twice the number of her neighbor Japan. Many of the Chinese students participated in the Peking revolution this last summer.

Our northern neighbor, Canada, has enrolled ten men, most of whom are in the graduate departments.

Formerly foreign students came to the University of Pennsylvania to enter the various graduate schools, but now an increasing number are entering the Wharton School of Finance and Commerce.

Started in 1912 as a small project, the International Students House is now an important organization in the University of Pennsylvania.

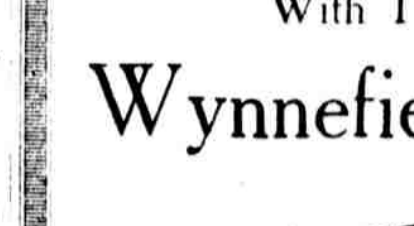
