LIBEL SUIT NOW LOOMS

New York, Sept. 28 .- Another at tempt to have a book suppressed as immoral—this time the classic "Saty. ricon of l'etronius Arbiter." fell flat under the gavel of a magistrate yester-

A summons obtained by Charles J. Bamber against Boni & Liveright for puffishing the book and against Harry J. Salzber; for offering to sell a copy was dismissed by Magistrate Oberwager, who said its value to the student and the scholar was such that it would be too serious a matter to deny

The magistrate confirmed other recent court opinions that one mustn't judge a book by isolated paragraphs, declaring that by this test the works of Shakespare and even the Bible gold be thrown into oblivion as incould be thrown into oblivion as in-

decent.

Magistrate Oberwager rendered a comprehensive opinion of thirteen pages, quoting from the Encyclopedia Britannica and severa' other authorities on literature, decisions of higher courts and his own convictions as to the contribution of the book to present day thought. thought.
The book portrays on important

part of the history of civilization."

part of the history of civilization," he said, "and the prosecution gives rise to the question whether the record of civilization can be suppressed."

"The Legislature did not intend to confer upon any individual or society general powers of censorship over literary works, for if such were the case the rower could easily be abused and the power could easily be abused and the destruction of the freedom of speech well as the freedom of press would resultant effects of such a statute." that the book in question was written by the Roman in the time of Nero.

"The Satyricon is a keen satire on the vulgarity of mere wealth, its vanity and its grossness, and constitutes a fragment containing parts of two books out of a total of sixteen." the magis-trate continued. "The author was interested in the intellectual pursuits, as well as in the vices and follies of his own evil time. The worship of the flesh and its lusts alternatively dis-gusted and fascinated him. "Time has determined that this work must survive, and were it simply a piece

of obscenity it would have perished long succ. The immoral writings, the pornographic literature of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. molder in forgotten libraries, where not even an antiquarian stirs the dust." After the decision, Horace Liveright, of Boni & Liveright, aunounced that a libel suit for \$25,000 damages would be instituted immediately by his firm against John S. Sumner and against the New York Society for the Suppression Vice on account of their statements in print and in court that his limited elitions of such works as the Satyricon were not truly really limited—that any one with the price would be supplied


