Chicago, Sept. 29.—The carlot move-ent of fruits and vegetables increased ment of fruits and vegetables increased pearly 400 during the week ended September 23, as compared to the previous week, according to the market review today of the United States Bureau of the Conomics. A total of

today of the United States Bureau of Agricultural Economics. A total of 24,386 cars moved, compared with 18,-286 the same week last year.

Potatoes showed the heaviest gain, 2300 cars. Shipments of grapes, apples, pears, cabbage, onions, celery and sweet potatoes were also heavier, while most other lines showed decreased move-

Potato shipments increased more than 50 per cent over the corresponding period last year. Minnesota led with 1345 cars. There were heavy shipments from New Jersey, Michigan, Wiscon-sin, the Dakotas, Colorado and Idaho. Apples from barrel-shipping States filled 2346 cars, while boxed apples from other States filled 745 cars. New York sent out 774 cars; Illinois, 318; Virginia, 221; Washington, 514; California, 151.






