**SUPREME COURT OPENS SESSIONS**

Convenes and Then Taft Administers Judicial Oath to Sutherland  
PROCEED TO WHITE HOUSE

Washington, Oct. 2.—The Supreme Court of the United States met at noon today for its October term with two of the nine seats upon the bench vacant. One, however, quickly was filled when Chief Justice Taft, as the first proceeding in a brief session given over to formalities, administered the judicial oath to former Senator George Sutherland, of Utah, as the successor of John H. Clarke, of Ohio, who resigned during the recess. Justice Sutherland was then conducted to the seat on the extreme left of the Chief Justice.  
The other chair, assigned to Associate Justice Pitney, will not be occupied by him in the near future because of illness.

The small courtroom, formerly the Senate chamber in the Capitol, was crowded, and a long line of tourists and other visitors stood in the corridor during the brief session unable to gain admission.  
Following the induction into office of the new Associate Justice, the Court admitted to practice a number of attorneys and then adjourned for the day to proceed to the White House to pay a visit of respect to the President.  
Justice Holmes, the oldest member of the court, who submitted to a serious surgical operation last summer, was present for the convening of the term, having returned in restored health and declared himself ready for the exacting duties of a crowded docket.  
Justice Day, nominated by the President to fill the vacancy in the settlement of German debts, and whose retirement from the bench had been rumored, was prepared to continue his judicial duties, giving no outward indication of an intention to lay them down in the near future.  
The program of business for the opening session was confined only to the usual acceptance of motions for admission of attorneys to practice.  
Hearing of cases will begin in the Court tomorrow, but there will be no opinions or orders from the Court until the following Monday.

**MISS HARRIS SAYS SHE GOT ONLY \$6500 FROM CHAPLIN**

Film Actress Admits She is on Verge of Bankruptcy  
Los Angeles, Oct. 2.—(By A. P.)—Mildred Harris, motion-picture actress, now on a vaudeville tour, declared she received only \$6500 from her former husband, Charlie Chaplin, after the lawyers had been paid, and she is about to go into bankruptcy, according to a letter from her which the Los Angeles Times printed today.  
Miss Harris' financial condition was brought about by two long illnesses and by being out of work for many months, said the letter.  
"I have been hounded for months by my creditors and have been paying most of my salary out to them weekly," said the letter, dated St. Paul.  
"Beside this, an ex-producer of mine is suing me for a large amount that he has no right to, as he is the one who two years ago sent me East to buy clothes for three pictures, and then canceled my contract on account of my divorce. Mr. Chaplin would not stand for me on the same program with him."


**FIND FATHER DEAD**

Ocean City Hotelman's Body Discovered by His Children  
Ocean City, Md., Oct. 2.—Edgar C. Gaskin, owner and proprietor of the New Avon Hotel at this resort, was found dead this morning in his bedroom.  
The cause of his death has not been determined, but it is thought it was due to natural causes.  
Mr. Gaskin lived at the hotel with his three small boys. No other persons were in the hotel at the time, and the body was discovered by the children this morning about 7 o'clock lying alongside of his bed. Mr. Gaskin came to Ocean City about fifteen years ago from Newark, N. C. He studied for the ministry for a while, but gave this up about thirteen years ago.

Los Angeles, Oct. 2.—(By A. P.)—Mr. and Mrs. William Jennings Bryan celebrated the thirty-eighth anniversary of their wedding yesterday at the home of their daughter, Mrs. Richard L. Hargrave, here.  
They received about 100 guests, including William G. McAdoo, Richard Pearson Hobson, Dr. Rufus B. von Kleinsmid, president of the University of Southern California, and Isadore B. Dockweiler, of Los Angeles.  
Mr. Bryan will leave today to campaign in eight States for congressional and senatorial candidates. He and Mrs. Bryan have two daughters, a son and ten grandchildren.

**After-Dinner Tricks**



No. 278—A Knockout  
A pile of checkers is set up as shown in the illustration, with a black checker second from the bottom. Any one is invited to remove the black counter without disturbing the rest of the pile. The problem will usually prove too difficult for its would-be solver.  
The trick is done with the aid of another checker, which is placed on edge near the pile. This is propelled rapidly against the stack by a downward stroke of the finger, as shown in the diagram. The propelled checker will strike squarely against the black one and will knock it clean out of the pile.

**ANTI-FIRE DRIVE IS OPENED TODAY**

'Prevention Week' Starts With Speeches Stressing Need of Carefulness  
SCHOOLS TO HEAR MESSAGE  
The great importance of guarding against fire will be emphasized repeatedly this week. "Fire Prevention Week" began today and will end next Monday.  
Firefighting and insurance officials will make addresses before the city's leading business clubs and associations and the message will be carried to many of the high and grammar schools.  
The campaign was arranged by the Fire Prevention and Insurance Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, in co-operation with Chief Davis, of the Fire Bureau and Fire Marshal Elliot. Stewart A. Jellett, chairman of the committee, will address the Lions' Club tomorrow, and C. A. Hexamer and J. Tracy will speak on fire prevention before the Rotary Club and the City Club on Wednesday.  
Mr. Elliott will speak at the William Penn High School and at the Baché, Hackett and Hoffman public schools. Chief Davis and a group of fire captains will visit various schools every day. John B. Morton, president of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, also will speak.
