INDICT FORMER U. S. TREASURER

Guy F. Allen and 26 Others Charged With Using Mails to Defraud

ACCUSED IN MOTOR DEALS

Washington, Oct. 3.—Samuel A. Carlson, Mayor of Jamestown, N. Y.; Guy F. Allen, former acting treasurer of the United States; James B. Maxwell, engineer, and twenty-four others were indicted yesterday by the Federal Grand Jury on charges of conspiracy to commit an offense against the United States and of using the mails to defraud.

The charges grew out of his sale of stock of Birmingham Motor, a common law trust of New York State, by which it is claimed property was defrauded in different ways. Alleged representations as to the financial and other conditions of the business are set forth in the indictments.

The original eighteen names which also are included in the indictments are: George H. Mechem, Sr., Vance V. Mechem, Harlan Van Hook, Alexander Austin, Robert V. Jackson, Franklin E. Bard, R. C. Northwood, I. T. Burrows and E. T. Bowman, salesman of the stock, were added to the list named in the indictment.

Vienna, Oct. 3.—A great sale of wines, brandies and liquors of almost priceless quality started yesterday when the Hapsburg Emperors' wine cellars in the Vienna palace were opened for public sale. Old tipplers, including diplomats and foreign visitors, attended the opening with shining eyes and watering lips, for such an opportunity will never be repeated.

The old Austrian and Hungarian vintages are pale gold colored. One special favorite of Franz Joseph was Schoenbrunner, vintage of 1897, which sold in 1908 for \$20 a bottle. Still other vintages of grapes, which former Emperor Charles favored, wonderful Klaines, Moselles, clarets and Hungarian Tokay, the color of amber with the flavor of raisins and nuts, and other vintages unrivaled in the world, some being almost priceless to the connoisseur, will go to any profit who bids higher than the next.

The Anglo-Saxons in Vienna, whether British or American, are specially interested in the Benedictine Monks' original champagne the production of which ceased more than twenty years ago, and old whiskies, mellow and smoother than any which can be found in England. Both were gifts to Franz Joseph in his halcyon days.

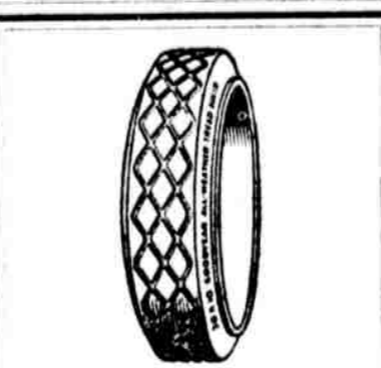
