Washington, Oct. 4.—Stockholders of the firm of One Star Limited, were called upon today by Major General J. G. Harbord, deputy chief of staff of the army, to come to the rescue of the "Old Line Insurance" business.

General Harbord pitched his remarks wholly in the language of the commercial world, saying he did so because the officers to whom he spoke were business and professional men, "carrying soldiering as a side line."
