Lord Halifax and Cardinal Mercier Are Working for Merger

London, Oct. 11.—That there are no fundamental obstacles to a union of the Church of England and the Church of Rome and that what division exists is due to a misunderstanding was declared today by the meeting of the English Church Union, presided over by the Rev. Lord Halifax, who is eighty-three, and who told his audience that this was the last occasion on which he ever expected to address them, reported on the progress he made in trying to find some means of bringing the two churches together.
