**SUGGESTS CITY TAX INSTALLMENT PLAN**

Municipal Research Bureau  
Says It Would Bring Payments in Earlier

So that taxes due the city would flow into the City Treasury earlier in the year, the Bureau of Municipal Research today suggested an installment plan of tax payments.  
"Philadelphia will start spending its 1923 taxes at the very beginning of 1923," the Bureau pointed out. "Accordingly, unless something is done to bring the taxes in as fast as they are spent, the city will continue its costly practice of using borrowed money to meet expenditures incurred on the strength of the taxes of the current year."

Discounts for tax payments earlier than in July and August and penalties for payments after that date do not bring tax payments in fast enough to keep pace with the city's financial needs, the Bureau stated.  
"Many persons who have given thought to this matter believe that the best all-around solution would be to have the year's taxes payable in installments," the Bureau continued. "Thus, if four installments were decided upon, they might be made payable in January, April, July and October. A small amount might be allowed on installments paid in advance, and substantial penalties added on installments that are not paid when due. Plans for collecting taxes in installments are not uncommon, and they seem to have met with approval wherever tried. They have the merit of getting the taxes in close to the time when they are needed, they make it easy for a large number of taxpayers to pay their taxes without having to accumulate and safeguard the full year's taxes; and they spread the taxpayers' burdens more evenly throughout the year."  
"The city ought to make a change in its tax payment provisions. It would do well to consider thoroughly the installment plan."

**MISCHA ELMAN GIVES FINE VIOLIN RECITAL**

Makes First Appearance for Several Years in This City

Mischa Elman made his first appearance for several years in this city last evening in a recital at the Academy of Music and showed that he has not lost his power of attracting audiences by any of his personal magnetism, nor the technique which makes him unique among solo violinists.

He has the same exquisite tone of great power and beauty and sonority or softness as in the past, the same vigor and perfect intonation, and the same generally bravura style of playing which he has done so much to make popular among a certain school of the younger violinists who have become one of the outstanding figures on the concert stage.

He played three big numbers, opening with the nonet, the "Rhapsody" of Handel and following with the concerto of Bach, unaccompanied. While this was played with technical and tonal perfection, it cannot be said that Bach is a composer in whose music Elman shows to the best advantage and several times he was dangerously near the point of over-enthusiasm in the three principal numbers he was at his best in the Violin Concerto. A minor concerto, a work of great brilliance if rather minor in scope, was played but one in which his perfect mastery of the resources of the violin enabled him to give with splendid effect.

Mr. Elman played as a novelty the "March" of the "Nightingale" by Korngold. On the whole the work is well named. It is a four-movement in the usual suite form, and while original in style, has not that wealth of violinistic melody which characterizes the best suites for the instrument. It was beautifully performed, of course, and was fairly successful, especially the "Rhapsody" of Handel, and the "Nightingale." The recital closed with a "Chaconne" arranged by Villa Lobos and two pieces of "Johann Sebastian" which Mr. Elman's was perhaps better than any other number in the program and was given with unusual skill and exquisite style and finish. He gave several encores in response to the demands of the audience.
