WILL LOAD SECOND RELIEF SHIP HERE

Couer d'Alene to Arrive October 21 for Cargo, Says Near East Director

ASKS FUNDS TO BUY FOOD

The Near East Relief is preparing to load another steamship at this port with foodstuffs for direct shipment to starving refugees from Smyrna. This was announced today by G. E. Sillway, regional director of Near East relief.

Because of existing diplomatic conditions it is not possible to send these relief ships directly to Constantinople, where are located the Near East bakeries which have been turning out 100,000 loaves of bread every day for the refugees.

The steamship Sanguis, which left the city yesterday was the first relief ship to leave America with supplies for these refugees. The second relief ship, the steamship Couer d'Alene, is scheduled to arrive here on October 21 from New York, where it is now loading part of the cargo.

The Near East Relief is asking contributions to buy foodstuffs for shipment on the Couer d'Alene. A total of \$20,000 worth of flour, corn and other foodstuffs went abroad on the Sanguis.

A telegram received by the Near East Relief tells of new atrocities by the Turks in Turkish coast towns north of Smyrna. The message was sent from the island of Mytilene, just off the coast of Smyrna, where there are 200,000 destitute refugees—victims of the Smyrna disaster.

Refugees being brought to Mytilene from the mainland by the Near East Relief, according to Lex W. Klutz, representing Beirut University, tell stories of fresh atrocities by Turkish soldiers who have advanced into the mainland to the north of Smyrna.

These refugees have been arriving at Mytilene almost naked and some of the men seriously injured through severe beatings by the Turks. They declared, according to Mr. Klutz, that the alleged Christian captives in the small towns outside of Smyrna have been forcibly taken by the Turks to do heavy work in the Turkish army. Hundreds of the old men and old women have been killed and others robbed of their possessions and left destitute and hungry. The younger women have been given over to the Turkish soldiers.

Mr. Klutz announced that the typhoid-breeding rainy season is scheduled to begin in about two weeks and that "many thousands of Christian refugees will surely perish before Thanksgiving unless more funds and supplies are immediately put at the disposal of the Relief Committee."

MYSTERIOUS CHINESE GIVES CLUE TO MISSING WOMAN

"Your Daughter Dead," He Says, and Quickly Disappears

Pittsburgh, Oct. 13.—(By A. P.)—Police have searched for a week for Chang Ma, a mysterious man known as "Betty Meyer." No trace of her could be found.

Her mother answered a rap at the door of their humble Carson street home and there stood a Chinese. He earnestly inquired if that was the home of "Betty." The eager mother assured him, and he disappeared.

"Your daughter dead."

He dashed from the steps and before the startled mother could make an entry he had disappeared. Police are searching Chinatown. They are also hunting for a North Side youth with whom the girl was friendly. He is missing from his usual haunts.

PROTEST WELLS' HISTORY

Book Opposed at Emporia, Kan., on Ground That It Is Improper

Topeka, Kan., Oct. 12.—(By A. P.)—A controversy over the adoption of Wells' Outline of History as a textbook at the Kansas State Normal School at Emporia has been referred by Governor Allen to the State Board of Administration for final settlement. The board has an investigation of the State educational administration.

"I have received a number of letters protesting the adoption of the book," said Governor Allen today. "Some oppose Mr. Wells' treatise on world history because it is irreligious, another that it is improper from the moral standpoint. None of the objections has been based on the fact that Wells is British."

SCHOOL STRIKE ENDS

Italian Children Return After One Day's Absence

Italian school children who were on strike and refused to attend school, celebrating a holiday on Columbus Day, were all back at their desks this morning, but with one day's absence marked against their records.

"Italians" stationed in front of the schools yesterday morning urged all children of Italian birth not to attend school. Messages sent to parents by school authorities urging them not to let their children stay away were ignored.

The trouble arose as a result of the Board of Education refusing to make Columbus Day a school holiday, although it is a legal holiday in Pennsylvania.

LIBEL SHIP FOR \$1,125,000

Union Oil Co. Asserts Luckenbach Was Responsible for Collision

San Francisco, Oct. 13.—(By A. P.)—A libel for \$1,125,000 has been filed in the Federal Court here against the Union Oil Company against the steamer Walter A. Luckenbach and the Walter A. Luckenbach Steamship Company.

The steamer Walter A. Luckenbach collided with the oil tanker Lyman Stewart in the strait here last Saturday night. The Lyman Stewart drifted upon rocks, and all effort to dislodge here has been unsuccessful.

The complaint says the Walter A. Luckenbach was responsible for the collision, because it was being operated at an inordinate rate of speed, and that it was not on the proper side of the midchannel.

FERRYBOAT RAIL BREAKS

Philadelphia Boy Among Four Others Injured Near Newport, R. I.

Peter Onigley Horwitz, son of Mrs. John J. Horwitz, of this city, who was Mrs. George Quintana Horwitz, was injured when the railing on an upper deck of the ferryboat Esplanade, plying between Annetstown and Southwesterly, R. I., gave way yesterday.

Horwitz, with four other boys, who were also injured, fell to the deck. The boys were all students at the St. George School, Newport, and were on their way to a picnic.
