New York. Oct. 19.—The two big news events in the financial world today was the big blow-up in the English political situation, with the resignation of the Lloyd George Coalition Cabinet and the announcement of the proposed big railway merger in the Northwest with the consolidation of the Great Northern, Northern Pacific and the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy. The stock market was kept in a feverishly churned condition, with prices plunging upward and downward in a most confusing manner, but not because of any influence on part of these events, but merely as result of the growing vigorousness of the context between the trading forces for supermacy. trading forces for supermacy.

It looked for a time during the morn-

ing operations as if the entire list was booked for a reaction of considerable dimensions. There was a startling crumbling of prices in all directions and support of the constructive appeared to have been withdrawn. Very positive weakness cropped out in widely scattered parts of the list, but suddenly, without any convincing or consistent reason, the whole market snapped back again just before midday was reached. Not only were the earlier recessions re-gained, but in most instances prices by the familiar strong-arm methods were jerked back to and above last night's closing level, with quite a few prominent recognized pool issues making new "tops" for the year. The resignation of the English Pre-

the resignation of the English Fre-mier and his Unbinet was not altogether unexpected, nor was the big railroad consolidation fresh news. Hints of the latter conference had been in the air for several days, and today's announcement was merely an official confirma-tion of the proposed merger. Others are expected, and possibly a great deal more of this kind of news will be heard after next week, when the Interstate Commerce Commission starts hearings on the suggested transportation amai-

The abundant offerings which met the initial rise in various shares en-couraged active selling by the short interest, resulting in a large proportion of the list being carried down a point or more below yesterday's final figures. Particular weakness in oils, steels and notors influenced extensive profit-takcurred in special stocks, notably in Liggert & Myers, which dropped 11 points; National Biscuit, 5½; Amer-can Express and Otis Elevator, 5 each, and Pacific Oil and Davison Chemical, 4 cach.

The market quickly steaded itself and many of the stocks showing soft-ness developed pronounced strength and allied with a good deal of vigor. Nevrtheless, the trading was conspicuously pecialized, with these selected stocks, acked up in a sensational manner for lefinite reasons pertaining only to those particular issues. Corn Products was in outstanding illustration in this concertion, as also was the renewed aggressive bullish tactics in some of the high-priced oils.
