

G. O. P. WOMEN PLAN TO AID DEMOCRAT

Delaware County Independents to Swing Support to Mrs. Dornblaser

NO REPUBLICAN NOMINEE

Supporters of the Democratic woman candidate because their own party declined to nominate a woman for the Legislature is planned by the independent Republican women of Delaware County, who met this afternoon in the Media Club, Media.

There have been rumblings of revolt in the county ever since the Vacancies Committee of the county organization named Harry Heyburn to fill the ticket vacancy caused by the death of Henry Miller.

At the primary election a woman had the highest number of votes of any of the unsuccessful candidates for legislative nominations in Delaware County. When the vacancy occurred, therefore, women leaders argued that a woman should be named for the place.

An effort was made on Wednesday to obtain indorsement of the Democratic nominee, Mrs. Florence L. Dornblaser, by the State League of Women Voters.

At the league's convention in 1921 a ruling was made to allow indorsement of candidates, provided a majority vote of the entire membership in a county desired such action. A straw vote to learn the attitude of the county branch

members disclosed that 288 women favored support of Mrs. Dornblaser and sixteen women opposed such action.

The executive board of the State League, however, refused to indorse the Democratic candidate. After this setback, the independent women arranged for a special meeting in the Media Club.

McSPARRAN IS TRAILING PINCHOT IN YORK-ADAMS

Democratic Candidate Addresses Numerous Party Rallies

Following virtually the same path as Gifford Pinchot, John A. McSparran, the Democratic candidate for governor, addressed large and enthusiastic rallies of his party in the York-Adams Congressional District today.

The first meeting was held at Dillsburg. From there the party went to Adams County, meetings being held at York Springs, Hendersville, Arendtsville, Oranum and Gettysburg. Last night meetings were held at Hanover and in the courthouse in York.

Besides McSparran, addresses were made by Robert E. Pattison, candidate for Lieutenant Governor, J. Marshall Coxen, candidate for Secretary of Internal Affairs; Fred B. Kerr, candidate for United States Senator, and local candidates.

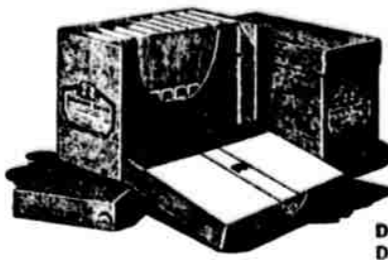

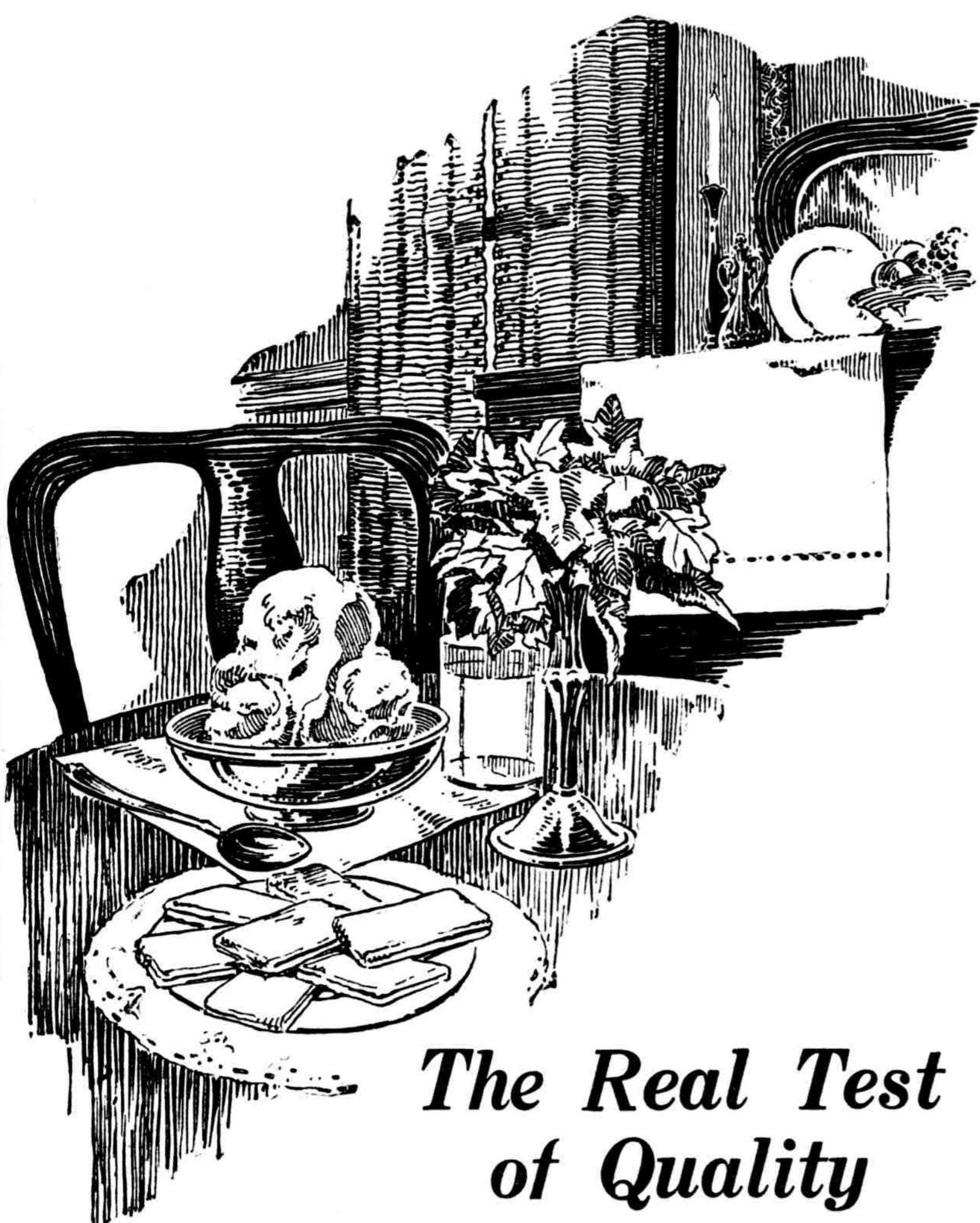

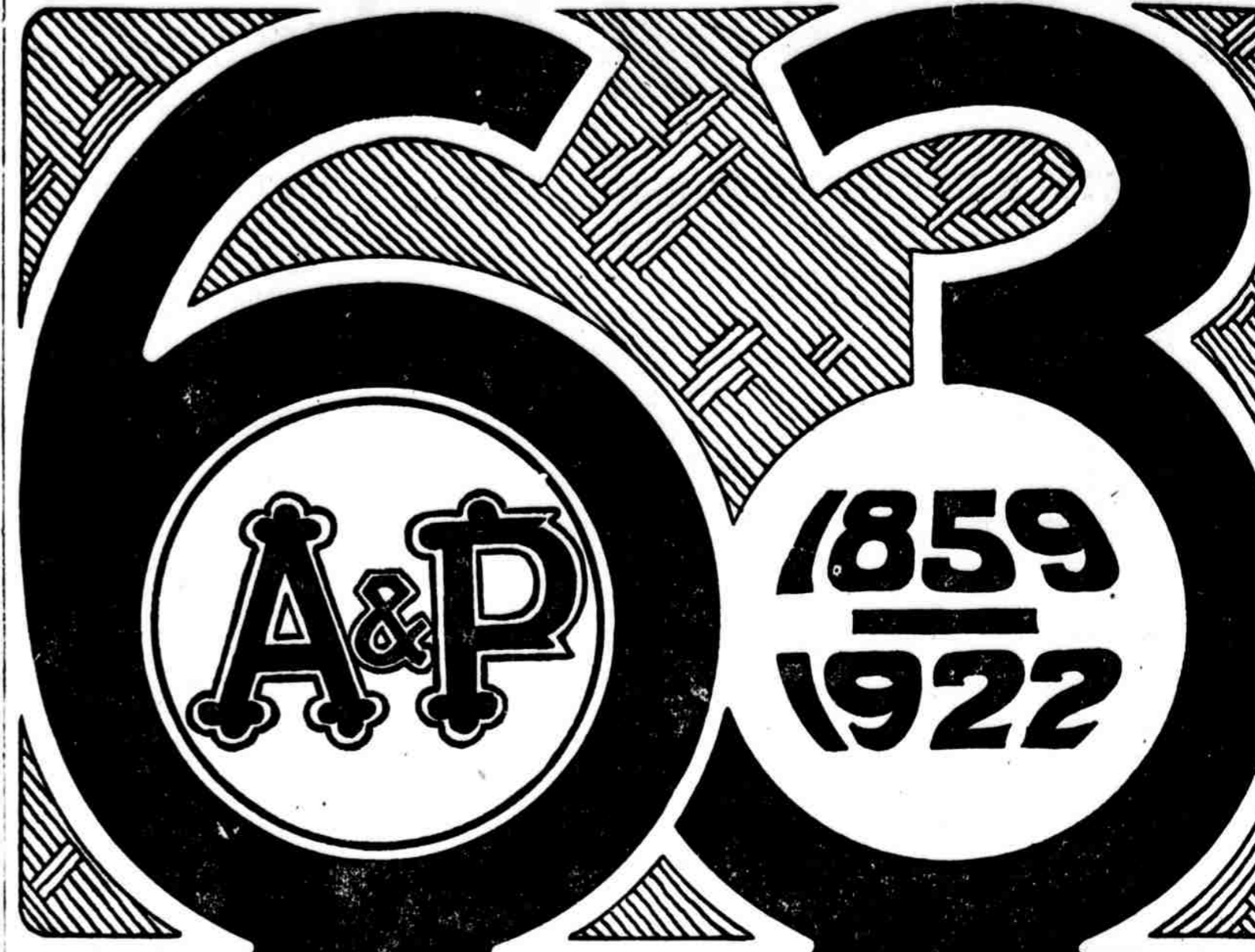
