

SHIP LINES APPEAL TO HALT DRY RULE

Counsel Likely Will Ask Supreme Court to Stop Enforcement Pending Suit

DRY CRAFT LOSS TO OWNERS

New York, Oct. 24.—Agreeing with Christopher Lasker, head of the United States Shipping Board, that dry American ships will mean a substantial loss, Oliver MacEwan, grand chief manager of Illinois, gave his own explanation of the loss in his address before the Grand Lodge of Illinois International Order of Good Fellows, at the opening of its sixteenth annual session here today.

"Mr. Lasker, head of the United States Shipping Board, tells us that dry American ships will mean a big loss," said Mr. MacEwan. "I agree with him and so do all the heads of all the shipping companies."

"The promoters of a drinking ship make a profit. They first make a huge profit on the intoxicating drinks that are sold to passengers, and second, they make a huge profit on the food that the drinking passengers do not eat."

"It is well-known fact that one of the chief effects of drinking, even to a small extent is loss of appetite, and the more whisky or brandy that is drunk the less food there is eaten. So we understand the anxiety of Mr. Lasker to have the bars open on American ships. His job depends upon his making the ships pay. If he does not, some one else may get his job."

SON OF LONGFELLOW CUTS OFF KIN IN WILL

"Socialist" Cause of Nephews Losing \$50,000 Each

New York, Oct. 24.—The surprise filed yesterday in the estate of Ernest Wadsworth Longfellow, artist and son of the poet, shows that he left an estimate of \$500,000 and that when he made a codicil cutting off his nephews, Prof. Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, Dana and Abbott Duran, because they were interested in the socialist cause, he specified in his will, if his nephews did not, some one else might get his job.

Prof. Dana, who is mentioned in the will as Harry Dana, is a Harvard graduate and was expelled from the department of English at Columbia in 1917 for distributing communistic literature. He joined the Marxists later, and has been living with his brother in Cambridge. The codicil to the will, made October 7, 1915, said:

"Owing to the Socialist and pacifist opinions of my nephews, Harry S. Dana and Abbott Duran, I strike out their names from my will as legitimate heirs of it."
