

# PINCHOT EULOGIZED BY SENATOR MOSES

### Candidate Declared to Be National Figure Who Will Be Honor to State

## DEFENDS NEW TARIFF BILL

Special Dispatch to Evening Public Ledger—Allentown, Pa., Oct. 25.—A glowing tribute to Gifford Pinchot featured the address of Senator George H. Moses, of New Hampshire, the principal speaker at a Republican rally held here last night.

"I rejoice to come to a Commonwealth whose dominant party has nominated for Governor my old associate, Gifford Pinchot," said Senator Moses. "Twenty years ago, while he was still a student of forestry, I learned to know him well to admire his character and respect him for his ambition to serve the public in a broad and capable way. He has grown to a national figure. His campaign has attracted the attention of the entire country. In Pinchot you will gain a Governor of a constructive type, who will be an honor to your Keystone State. I expect and predict that you Pennsylvanians will place him in a large majority. No State will have an able executive or one who will serve the people better."

Senator Moses defended the new tariff bill, which draws on national lines without sectional prejudice and predicted its success as a business measure. He justified his stand against the League of Nations and declared he was proud to be numbered with George Wharton Pepper and other true Americans who encompassed its defeat on his side of the Atlantic.

Two classes of persons, Senator Moses said, still are for the League of Nations, one knowing nothing about it and the other too much. The latter class, he said, is composed of international bankers and he charged they had so manipulated its drafting that they hoped to obtain from it a five-cent tax on exports. He opposed the election of Senators Pepper and Reed, and asserted they would guard against insidious attempts to bring the League measure into the United States.

The Rev. Dr. J. G. Barnes was chairman of the rally and other speakers were State Senator Horace W. Lantz, Congressman Fred B. Gettle, Edward F. Francis, of Kentucky, and Mrs. Charles Gordon, of Darby.

## FAVORS CHURCH UNION

Denominations Mentioned in Detroit Convention Resolution. Detroit, Oct. 25.—By a 17-11 vote, the union of six large Protestant denominations is favored in a resolution adopted by the Detroit Association of Congregational Churches, in session here.

The denominations mentioned in the resolution are the Methodist, Presbyterian, Baptist, Congregational, Pentecostal, Episcopal and Evangelical churches.

The estimate will cost approximately \$2,750,000. It will contain 500 seats.
